ORDINANCE NO.

Authorize contract with Michael Willis Architects for design services for the Interstate Maintenance Facility Rehabilitation Project (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Portland Water Bureau's Interstate Maintenance Facility is the headquarters for approximately 300 employees. These employees provide support services required to maintain, operate, and expand the City's drinking water delivery system. The facility has several structures of varying size and age.
- 2. The main building is referred to as the Maintenance Building. It is also the oldest, having been constructed in 1925 with bricks and mortar. A seismic evaluation of the Maintenance Building determined that it would be vulnerable to a sizable earthquake event. The design and construction do not fulfill the current and future operational needs of the Portland Water Bureau.
- 3. A new building will be constructed to assure the safety of the employees and fulfill the Portland Water Bureau operational requirements as an essential City service.
- 4. The Bureau requires consultant services for the design of the Interstate Maintenance Facility Rehabilitation Project. These services include the design of the new Maintenance Building, the development of construction documents, and construction observation.
- 5. Request for Proposal WTR 061 was advertised in January 2008 as part of the formal competitive solicitation process in accordance with the City Code for Professional Contracts.
- 6. After determining that Michael Willis Architects was the successful Proposer, the project was put on hold because the budget for this project was not approved until the current fiscal year.
- 7. While the project was on hold, two changes to the scope of work became necessary. Changes in City policy shifted the responsibility of obtaining LEED certification from the City to the Contractor. In addition, the geotechnical report that was to be used to drive design decisions is now out of date. The Contractor now has to perform a new geotechnical investigation to generate a current report.
- 8. \$350,428, or approximately 18.6%, of the contract dollars will be awarded to State of Oregon certified Minority, Women, and Emerging Small Businesses.
- 9. The not to exceed value of the contract is \$1,885,034. The Confidence Level for this contract is High. Funding for the project is available in the FY 2010-11 Budget and will be requested in the FY 2011-12 and FY 2012-13 Budgets.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. That the Commissioner-in-Charge and Auditor are authorized to execute on behalf of the City a contract with Michael Willis Architects in a form in accordance with the contract attached as Exhibit A.
