# PORTLAND PUBLIC SCHOOLS and PORTLAND PARKS & RECREATION FACILITIES

This intergovernmental agreement is entered into by Portland Public Schools (PPS) and
the City of Portland, by and through its Bureau of Parks & Recreation (PP&R), on the
day of, 2010

Whereas, the Parties to this agreement are mutually interested in providing programs, facilities and services that benefit children, their families and the Portland community; and

Whereas, the Parties have historically had numerous individual agreements regarding sites and programs; and

Whereas, these Parties recognize that through a more comprehensive collaboration they can enhance the quality and quantity of the programs, facilities, and services they collectively offer; and

Whereas, these Parties recognize the framework of an operating agreement is critical to successful collaborations of this kind.

*Now therefore,* for and in consideration of the mutual promises and agreements of the Parties herein contained, it is agreed as follows:

#### Article I. Vision

#### Section 1.01 Vision

(a) Portland Parks & Recreation and Portland Public Schools partner to offer children and adults a more comprehensive range of services and added value through mutual cooperation, collaboration and use of public resources.

#### Section 1.02 Guiding Principles

- (a) Both organizations are committed to working together successfully to enhance student and community access to recreational and educational facilities and agree to the following guiding principles:
  - 1) Support children and their families through meaningful partnerships.
  - 2) Create educational and recreational opportunities that benefit the Portland community as a whole.
  - 3) Support strong and meaningful relationships among the collaborating agencies, users and places.
  - 4) Identify and implement joint use of space to reduce capital costs and increase operational efficiencies, demonstrating to Portland's citizens the responsible use of limited resources.
- (b) School facilities and city parks will serve as increasingly critical community resources as Portland's population and density increases, placing more demand on public facilities dedicated to life-long learning, recreation and open space. This Agreement is intended to help support that future need.

#### Article II. General Provisions

#### Section 2.01 Purpose of Agreement

To provide a flexible framework for managing and expanding shared use and joint development of facilities in an effective and efficient manner that will enhance the programs and services available to the Portland community.

## Section 2.02 Parties to The Agreement

#### (a) Portland Public Schools

- 1) Mission: By the end of elementary, middle, and high school, every student by name will meet or exceed academic standards and will be fully prepared to make productive life decisions.
- 2) Presence: PPS owns property, which include school buildings and athletic facilities, at over 100 locations throughout Portland. Additionally, PPS offers various youth and adult programs and activities at facilities throughout the community. PPS's programs and school buildings provide a foundation of academics, athletics and socialization for the majority of Portland's children.

### (b) Portland Parks & Recreation

1) Mission: Portland Parks & Recreation contributes to the city's vitality by establishing and safeguarding the parks, natural resources and urban forests that are the soul of the city, ensuring that green spaces are accessible to all; by developing and maintaining excellent facilities and places for public recreation, building community through play and relaxation, gathering and solitude; and by providing and coordinating recreation services and programs that contribute to the health and well-being of residents of all ages and abilities.

2) Presence: Portland Parks & Recreation is the steward of 10,000 acres of land at more than 250 locations including a multitude of community and neighborhood parks, natural areas, recreational facilities, gardens, and trails. It also offers thousands of recreation and enrichment opportunities for people of all ages.

#### Section 2.03 Term

- (a) **Effective Date** This agreement is effective upon execution by both Parties.
- (b) **Duration** The agreement will remain in effect for ten years from its effective date unless terminated by either Party in accordance with Section 2.04.
- (c) **Renewal** The agreement may be renewed, including any and all mutually agreed upon revisions or additions to the agreement, for additional terms of up to ten years subject to the mutual consent of the governing bodies.

#### Section 2.04 Withdrawal from Agreement

- a) **Notice Required.** Should either Party determine that it must withdraw from the agreement, it will give the remaining Party at least 120 days' notice of its intent to withdraw.
- b) **Fulfillment of Obligations**. The withdrawing Party will fulfill all commitments under this agreement, including granting access to its facilities, until the conclusion of the 120-day notice period, unless relieved of these obligations by the remaining Party. Any ongoing contractual obligations of the withdrawing Party to third Parties will remain in effect.

#### Article III. Communication and Collaboration

#### Section 3.01 Understandings

- (a) Achieving the purpose of this agreement will require effective communication and collaboration.
- (b) By building on the strengths and utilizing the resources of each Party, creative and innovative approaches to problem solving in the delivery of programs and services can be achieved.
- (c) Adhering to the framework of this agreement will better position the organizations to attract funding support to sustain and enhance their programs and services.

#### Section 3.02 Communications

- (a) **Collegial Communication** The foundation of effective collaboration is ongoing communication. Staff members at all levels will develop and maintain collegial interagency relationships appropriate to their roles.
- (b) Collaborative Promotion Employees of the organizations will work together to provide information that allows effective communication about programs, facilities and services delivered under this agreement.

#### Section 3.03 Management Committee

- (a) **Purpose** In order to implement this agreement and more effectively deliver services, a Management Committee is formed. The role of the Management Committee is to focus on the organizational and policy issues relevant to both Parties, while operational managers will address the day to day details of joint use. This committee will also work to reinforce a commitment to the joint use of facilities at all levels of both organizations.
- (b) **Membership** The membership of the Management Committee will include the following representatives, their functional equivalents, or their designees:
  - 1) Portland Parks & Recreation

Manager- Workforce & Community Alliances

**Property Manager** 

Manager- Parks & Recreation Services

2) Portland Public Schools

Director of Facilities & Asset Management

**Property Manager** 

Communications/Community Relations Project Manager (FAM)

- (c) **Meetings** The Committee will meet as needed, but at least twice annually, to address issues related to the joint development and use of facilities and properties to better serve our communities.
- (d) Committee Tasks The Management Committee will meet to develop recommendations on the following list of developmental and operational tasks:
  - 1) Assess/review the needs and interests of our communities and the current program offerings to determine any gaps or overlap in programming:
  - 2) Collaborate in the development of a comprehensive approach to programming that makes the best use of the Parties' collective resources;
  - 3) Develop frameworks concerning the joint use of facilities;
  - 4) Identify new joint use or development opportunities;
  - 5) Assess opportunities to reduce operating costs through cooperation or collaboration;
  - 6) Identify shared staff training and professional development opportunities that will enhance collaboration as well as individual programs;
  - 7) Clarify the Coordinator's role and responsibilities, as well as the individual Parties' roles in supporting the coordinator;

- 8) Identify additional agencies or organizations whose participation would further enhance the collaborative arrangement;
- 9) Review and amend, as needed, this Collaborative Agreement and the operating procedures to ensure they effectively support the collaborative effort, accommodate changes in circumstances, and take advantage of new opportunities for collaboration;
- 10) Evaluate the services provided by the Parties in light of changing community needs and interests; and
- 11) Develop shared marketing and fundraising initiatives that would enable the Parties to expand programs and enhance their collaborative efforts; and
- 12) Consider reports from various facility and program managers about the challenges of operating in the spirit of the agreement.
- 13) The Parties will explore opportunities to reduce their collective costs for facility management through cooperative agreements, which may involve strategies such as exchanging services, sharing equipment, rotating the responsibility for providing services or taking advantage of their increased, combined buying power.

#### (e) Coordinator

- 1) Selection: The Management Committee will select from among its members a Coordinator to serve in that role for one year. The Coordinator responsibilities will rotate between the Parties on a yearly basis.
- 2) Responsibilities: The Coordinator will assume responsibility for shared functions, including, but not limited to, the following:
  - a. Convening the committee and chairing its meetings;
  - b. Providing each agency with a summary of the Committee's discussions and directions and ensure that each agency is informed of them in a timely manner;
  - c. Coordinating the dissemination and implementation of procedures and policies developed by the committee;
  - d. Facilitating the resolution of disputes within the committee; and
  - e. Performing other functions, identified by the committee, that help to carry out the goals and vision of this Collaborative Agreement.
- 3) Cost Sharing: The Parties will share the cost of participating in the Management.Committee. Each Party will be responsible for staff costs during the year they coordinate the Committee.

#### Section 3.04 Dispute Resolution

It is the intent of this agreement that disputes relating to joint use will be resolved collaboratively at the lowest organizational level possible, by staff closest to the operations of each facility. Disputes regarding operational issues which cannot be resolved at the facility level or by operations staff will be referred to the Management Committee for resolution. When necessary, the Management Committee will refer issues of policy, issues with resource implications, and other issues it cannot resolve to the agency Director or Superintendent, or their designees.

#### Article IV. Joint Use of Facilities

#### Section 4.01 Understandings

- (a) All uses of the facilities shall be compatible with, first, the primary mission of the Party owning the facility, and secondly, the vision of this Collaborative Agreement.
- (b) The property owner has first priority for use of its facilities, and, so long as it does not conflict with the property owner's needs or prior agreements including those with third parties, the other Party has second priority as to the facilities governed by this Agreement. The Parties' current usage as of the execution date of this Agreement is summarized in Exhibit A: Scope of Annual Permits for Joint Use of PPS and PP&R Facilities Under Collaboration Agreement and Exhibit B Site Specific Agreements, attached hereto.
- (c) The Parties must honor the rights of tenants and permittees at each facility and property. Each Party has the right to enter into third party agreements for the use of its own facilities. In such cases, the permits of the other Party, for the use of the facility, may be terminated. In such case, the property owner will consult with the other Party to reasonably mitigate any impacts.
- (d) Each Party will give reasonable notice of its intent to enter into a third party agreement and will consult with the other Party to reasonably mitigate any impacts.
- (e) Portland Parks & Recreation and Portland Public Schools must preserve their flexibility to respond programmatically to the educational needs of Portland's youth, the diverse and changing needs of the immediate community as well as the city at large.
- (f) Portland Public Schools and Portland Parks & Recreation are required by their respective governing bodies to meet revenue generation expectations and expenditure limitations.
- (g) Portland Public Schools has the right, at their sole discretion, to require exclusive use of their facilities during school hours. In such case, the property owner will consult with the other Party to reasonably mitigate any impacts.
- (h) Use of facilities will be in accordance first with all federal, state, and local laws; second with the policies of the facility owner; and third with the provisions of this Collaboration Agreement.
- (i) It is the intent of the Parties that the scale and extent of the annual exchange of use permits by the Parties described in Exhibit A will continue or expand in their scope in subsequent years, subject to the considerations and limitations in subsections (a) through (g) of this section or other modifications agreed upon by the Parties.

#### Section 4.02 General Guidelines for Use

- (a) Unless otherwise agreed in writing, each Party agrees to comply, and require its permittees to comply, with the following General Guidelines when using the other Party's facilities:
  - 1) Use only the permitted facilities and only at the permitted times;
  - 2) Leave the facility in as good or better condition than it was at the beginning of each use. If left in such condition, no custodial fees will be assessed;
  - 3) Keep the facility free from safety hazards, damage and unsightliness;
  - 4) Allow reasonable access to the facility for the property owner's maintenance workers and other staff:
  - 5) Report safety concerns and accidents to the facility manager within 24 hours, following the property owner's reporting procedure;
  - 6) Remove personal property (including containers, equipment, fencing, etc) after each use or, if agreed to in writing, at the end of the season (e.g. sport season); and
  - 7) If applicable, lock doors or otherwise secure the facility after use.

#### Section 4.03 Scheduling of Usage

#### (a) Ongoing uses

- 1) The Parties will continue to submit requests for ongoing use to the permit center of the other Party. Such requests for ongoing use are typically made in mid-summer and early winter and blanket permits are issued. All requests that are consistent with the terms of this Agreement and prior use will be approved, unless otherwise agreed by the Management Committee. Except for those site specific uses authorized in Exhibit B, all joint uses shall be authorized by official PPS Civic Use of Buildings (CUB) and/or PP&R Park permit.
- Additional requests may be made for ongoing uses that are not included in blanket permits issued during the annual cycles; however, it is understood that the property owner may deny such requests if the facility has already been permitted to a third party.
- 3) Portland Parks & Recreation is authorized to issue permits to third party users of Portland Public Schools' facilities but only for those times and facilities for which it has been granted use pursuant to a CUB permit or pursuant to the terms of the agreements listed in Exhibit B of this Agreement. All aspects of managing the permits, including addressing issues relating to facility users, are the responsibility of PP&R.
- 4) From time to time the Parties may need to cancel a specific date of use under one or more permits to accommodate its own program needs. Both parties shall endeavor to give the other Party at least ten day's notice of the need to cancel a specific permitted activity on a specific day or at a specific time.

#### (b) Event and tournament uses

- 1) When a Party wishes to use a facility for one-time events, the Party shall obtain a use permit through the normal CUB or Park Permit process. The requesting Party shall make arrangements for use at least seven (7) days in advance. School principals and PP&R managers must conform to this rule in order to ensure the least amount of programmatic disruption to the other Party.
- When a Party wishes to use a sports facility for tournaments that are in addition to regular league practices and games, the Party shall seek a use permit through the normal CUB or Park Permit process. The Parties may charge their standard fees for tournament uses. All aspects of managing permits for this type of use, including addressing issues relating to facility users are the responsibility of the permit holder.

#### (c) Cancellation or termination of facility uses

- 1) By the Party using the facility.
  - If a Party does not intend to use a facility that it is scheduled to use, it will make every effort to notify the appropriate permitting center as soon as possible, so that other third Party uses may be accommodated.
- 2) By the property owner.
  - i. If a property owner needs to close a facility for the purpose of repair, renovation, or maintenance, the owner may withdraw its authorization for usage of that property upon 30 days notice to the other Party. The property owner will make a good faith effort to mitigate interference with regular, ongoing uses of its facilities.
  - ii. If a property owner needs to close a facility, listed either in Exhibit A or B, in order to allow for a facility expansion, change of use, or the replacement of the facility including site redesign to accommodate the property owner's mission, or to allow its redevelopment or sale to meet revenue generation expectations and expenditure limitations, the owner may withdraw its authorization for usage of that property upon 120 days notice to the other Party. In such case, the property owner will consult with the other Party to reasonably mitigate any impacts.
  - iii. If a closure is required due to urgent safety or security concerns, emergency maintenance or repair requirements, severe weather or other "acts of God", the property owner is required only to give reasonable notice of the closure.
  - iv. Facility and site uses may be terminated for the remainder of the sports season by the property owner if the operational or safety procedures or the terms of this Agreement are not adhered to after the property owner has given the using Party a reasonable time to address such issues. If needed, the Management Committee may be asked to help address the issue.

v. Neither Party shall be liable for any inconvenience or damages, consequential or otherwise, that result from any closure under this provision.

#### Article V. Compensation for Facility Use

#### Section 5.01 Compensation

- (a) Unless otherwise specifically stated herein or in future written agreements, the Parties will not charge each other a rental fee for the uses authorized by this Agreement and the rental permits issued under this Agreement.
- (b) Periodically the Parties, through the Management Committee, will review the uses made and services provided by each Party and determine whether those uses and services are reasonably equitable, and if it is determined that they are not, then the Parties may agree upon a reasonable fee for use or services provided. In the event that such fees are mutually agreed upon, PPS's Superintendent and PP&R's Director, or their designees, are authorized to approve payment of any such fees, subject to annual budget approvals.
- (c) If owned by and available from the property owner, the Parties may request the other Party to provide auxiliary equipment to support the use of the facility. Examples include: bleachers for games, audio visual equipment for meetings and auditoria, podia/lecterns, portable restrooms, etc. The owner and/or provider of the auxiliary equipment may invoice the user for actual costs incurred for the delivery and set-up/take-down of these amenities.

#### Section 5.02 Financial Information

The Parties recognize the financial accountability requirements that each is subject to. The Parties agree to share with one another all reasonable requests for financial information that pertain to the joint use of its facilities in a timely manner. This information will be used for the purpose of understanding, computing, and articulating the financial benefits of the collaborative relationship to both the Parties and to the community at large. The Parties agree to cooperate in and jointly fund a formal assessment of the financial implications of the collaborative arrangement at mutually agreed to times.

#### Article VI. Facility Management

#### Section 6.01 Facility Maintenance

- (a) Unless otherwise specified in this agreement each Party will assume responsibility for providing normal and customary custodial, maintenance, and utility services for the properties and facilities it owns.
- (b) In the event that the Party using a facility or property, or its permittee, fails to timely perform any written obligations under the terms of its use permit or under the terms of the site specific agreements as specified in Exhibit B, or otherwise as required under the terms of this agreement, the property owner, after reasonable written notice to the Party and an opportunity to cure, may

perform the appropriate service and charge the using Party its reasonable costs to perform the services.

#### Section 6.02 Facility Security

- (a) Each partner will assume responsibility for providing, or insuring that its permittees provide, any necessary security services for the properties and facilities in conjunction with and appropriate to the use of the facility it owns.
- (b) Unless otherwise agreed in writing, during the hours being managed or used by PPR or its permittees, PPS properties and facilities are deemed parks for enforcement purposes and all Park rules and policies may be applied, unless Parks permitted activities are not allowed under PPS policies.

#### Section 6.03 Facility Development and Improvements

- (a) The Parties agree to discuss opportunities for collaboration, including financial contributions, when improvements to the facilities would benefit both Parties.
- (b) To the extent resources allow, each Party will provide the other with its professional services and expertise related to the development or improvement of properties and programs. Unless such service or advice is of a nominal nature, or both Parties are providing services that the Management Committee finds reasonably equal, the Parties will agree in writing as to the scope of services, compensation, and other relevant terms and conditions. The Party seeking services or advice agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the other Party from any and all liabilities that may arise related to these services or advice, subject to the limits of the Oregon Tort Claims Act and the Oregon Constitution.
- (c) The Parties will consult with each other prior to making any significant improvements to a jointly used Facility.
- (d) The Party making improvements or changing an existing use will take the lead in obtaining any required land use approvals and in facilitating community involvement, when needed. The other Party will cooperate with efforts to obtain approvals or other permits.

#### Article VII. Indemnification and Insurance

#### Section 7.01 Indemnification

Subject to the limits of the Oregon Tort Claims Act and the Oregon Constitution, each Party shall indemnify and hold harmless the other Party and its officers, agents, and employees from any and all liability, damages, expenses, attorneys fees, causes of action, suits, claims or judgments, arising out of or connected with (i) the Party's or its invitee's use of a facility, (ii) any failure of the Party to comply with the terms of this Agreement or any violation of law or ordinance, and (iii) the acts or omissions of the Party, its officers, directors, agents and employees or invitees; provided, however, the Party shall not be liable for claims caused by the negligence or willful acts or omissions of the other Party, its officers, directors, agents and employees.

#### Section 7.02 Workers Compensation

Each Party and its subcontractors, if any, and all employers working under these agreements are subject employers under the Oregon Workers' Compensation Law and shall comply with ORS 656.017, which requires them to provide workers' compensation coverage for all their subject workers.

#### Article VIII. General Provisions

#### Section 8.01 Agency Autonomy

The provisions of this Agreement are not intended to impinge upon the management of Parties' programs, including, but not limited to, staff selection and supervision.

#### Section 8.02 Amendments

(a) This Agreement may be amended by the mutual written consent of the Parties. To the extent that an amendment does not significantly alter the financial obligations or assumption of risk of the Party, the Director of Portland Parks & Recreation or her designee and the Superintendent of Portland Public Schools or her designee are authorized to execute amendments without further consent by their governing bodies. (b) All future cooperative agreements, whether site specific or general in nature, between the Parties shall be discussed by the Management Committee and if agreed upon will be proposed as amendments to this Collaborative Agreement for approval pursuant to 8.02 (a).

#### Section 8.03 Integration of Agreement and Exhibits

This agreement is the entire agreement between Portland Public Schools and the Portland Parks & Recreation regarding joint use of facilities and supersedes all related prior written or oral discussions or agreements. The terms of any prior use agreements, solely between the Parties, applicable to facilities subject to this Agreement, except for those terms listed and described in Exhibit B, are no longer effective.

Exhibit A describes the annual exchange of use permits for the use of fields, gymnasiums, and other facilities between the Parties subject to the considerations and limitations set out in Section 4.01.

Exhibit B describes the Site Specific agreements for the use of various facilities by the Parties, including the responsibilities of each of the Parties for the operation and maintenance of the facility or parts thereof and any special arrangements affecting the area or hours of use, or other site specific use requirements.

Exhibit C lists agreements, resolutions, ordinances, or other similar formal or informal agreements or directives, whether expired or currently applicable, that are terminated by the execution of this agreement. The scope of Exhibit C is not exclusive: it is the express intent of the Parties to terminate any prior use agreements, whether referred to or not in Exhibit C, that bear on the exchange of use permits described in Exhibit A or on the Site Specific Agreements listed in Exhibit B.

All exhibits attached to this Agreement are incorporated by reference.

## Section 8.04 Excluded Agreements

Agreements between the City of Portland, Oregon and Portland Public Schools relating to the use, management, ownership, disposition, or other matters for the following facilities or properties are not subject to the terms of this agreement: Rice School (6433 NE Tillamook), King Neighborhood Facility (4906 NE 6<sup>th</sup>), Rosa Parks School (8906 N Woolsey), and the Green Thumb site (6801 SE 60<sup>th</sup>). Additionally, other than those agreements specifically terminated herein, this Agreement does not affect any agreements between the Parties that grant any property rights or interests.

#### Wilson Pool

City and PPS 1956. Agreement (no signed agreement located- authorized by City Ordinance 104293) Agreement provides for the construction of the pool by City on PPS property and for PPS to provide dressing and shower rooms (locker rooms), to furnish supplies except water, and provide for pool cleaning, heating of the water, and operating filtration and disinfectant equipment. City to operate and program pool and provide for its repair and maintenance.

City and PPS 1962. Agreement providing that PPS may have use of the pool after PP&R swim season but is responsible for water supply, repairs, and operation during such use.

City and PPS 1996 agreement (authorized by City Ordinance 170439) to allow construction of accessory building and water slide at the Wilson Pool including fence relocation.

#### Rieke Field

PPS and PP&R 1998 Reike Sports Fields Joint Use Agreement to fund and construct soccer field as well as the relocation and reconstruction of Rieke baseballdDiamond.

## **Grant High School (northeastern parking lot)**

City Revocable Permit in 1956 (Ordinance 104465) for the use of City property for Grant School parking subject to the condition that the lot is available to the general public and that the area cannot be used for any other purpose. No expiration date specified.

#### Powell Park (PP&R Park)

City Revocable Permit in 1999(Ordinance 173364) to allow installation of scoreboard by PPS, transfer of ownership of scoreboard to City, and maintenance by PPS. No expiration date specified.

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
