## **ORDINANCE NO.** 184258

\* Extend contract with Southeast Portland Animal Hospital for three years and increase by amount not to exceed \$60,000 for veterinary care for Police Bureau canines (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 38257)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The City, through the Portland Police Bureau (PPB) and Portland Fire & Rescue (PF&R), work with highly trained police canines.
- 2. In 2008, PPB used the competitive solicitation process to enter into a Professional, Technical, Expert Services (PTE) contract with Southeast Portland Animal Hospital (SPAH) for veterinary care services for eight dogs in the K-9 unit, for a total not-toexceed \$25,000.
- 3. In 2009, PPB issued Amendment No. 1 to extend the contract for one year, add two additional dogs from the Drug & Vice unit, and increase the value by not-to-exceed \$6,250, which is 25% of the value of the contract.
- 4. The current contract expired on August 1, 2010.
- 5. The total for this contract shall not exceed \$91,250 for the five year period.
- 6. In addition, PF&R would like to become a party to the contract and add their Arson Canine to the current contract.
- 7. SPAH would like to adjust their cost for services to reflect current costs.
- 8. PPB will pay for its veterinary care costs out of its existing appropriation as appropriate for the next three fiscal years.
- 9. PF&R will pay for its veterinary care costs out of its existing appropriation budget as appropriate for the next three fiscal years.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

a. The Mayor and Auditor are authorized to amend Contract No. C38257 with the Southeast Portland Animal Hospital, to add three additional years, increase the total value of the contract not-to-exceed \$91,250, and authorize the current costs proposed by Southeast Portland Animal Hospital, in a form substantially in accordance with the amendment attached to the original of this ordinance and, by reference, made a part hereof. Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the existing contract is set to expire on August 1, 2010 and Police Canines need continuing veterinary care; therefore this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
