7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Include:

-history of project – On July 15, 2010, Council passed Resolution No. 36800, authorizing a Fire Equipment Bond Measure to be placed on the November 2, 2010 ballot. The Resolution passed on condition that if the Bond Measure was successful that Portland Fire & Rescue would offer a resolution directing OMF to set aside each year the apparatus replacement appropriation from the General Fund into a dedicated apparatus replacement fund for the next five years starting FY 2010-2011 and resume the regular appropriation to PF&R of approximately \$1,800,000 plus inflation annually for apparatus replacement thereafter.

On November 2, 2010, the voters passed County Measure 26-117, Fire Equipment Bond. **-legal issues** – No legal issues have been identified.
