1) Legislation Title:

*Amend Intergovernmental Agreement with Portland State University to provide funds in the amount of \$15,050 for expansion of Single Family Weight Study to include Food Scrap Pilot Project and provide for payment. (Ordinance; amend IGA No. 30000595)

2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

The City has authorized IGA's with PSU for years to weigh residential garbage containers and compile data that allows the City to set rates for citywide franchised garbage hauling. This Ordinance amends IGA No. 3000595, which runs for 2009-2011. The City will be asked to authorize a new IGA for 2011-13.

In 2010, the City asked PSU to apply its services to the Curbside Food Scrap Collection Pilot, which involved additional tasks, routes and systems. The additional tasks require additional compensation in the amount of \$15,050. Because the current IGA expires on January 31, 2011, we are extending the date to ensure ability to process the amendment and make a timely payment.
