For Council Action Items

1) Legislation Title:

* Amend subrecipient contract with American Red Cross, Oregon Trail Chapter to add \$50,000 to continue operating severe weather warming centers for people experiencing homelessness. (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 32000263)

2) Legislation:

Beginning in FY 2009-10, PHB developed Contact No. 32000263 with the American Red Cross, Oregon Trail Chapter (Red Cross) to operate severe weather warming centers for people experiencing homelessness. The contract was subsequently amended to extend the contract end-date to April 15, 2011, (Amendment 1). Through this contract and its subsequent amendment, the Red Cross annually provides up to 15 nights of severe weather warming center operations, with capacity to shelter up to 150 – 300 people experiencing homelessness nightly. Severe weather warming center operations are a critical component of the City's Standard Operating Procedures for Severe Weather Alert & Severe Weather Emergency Warming Center For the Protection of Unsheltered People during Cold Weather.

This proposed amendment (Amendment 2) adds to the contract \$50,000 in City general funds previously allocated to PHB's FY 2010-11 budget for this purpose and clarifies elements of the statement of work.

Under contract with PHB, the American Red Cross, Oregon Trail Chapter (Red Cross) operates severe weather warming centers that provide expanded shelter capacity of 150 - 300 beds per night during up to 15 nights during on which forecasted weather conditions pose an immediate danger to the life and health of unsheltered people.

PHB's existing contract with the Red Cross began in FY2009-10, and was extended through amendment to April 15, 2011, to secure unspent funds from the FY2009-10 contract. To fully fund the contracted activities for FY2010-11, PHB requested and was allocated \$50,000 in one-time-only City general funds. The addition of these funds brings the two year not-to-exceed amount of the contract to \$125,000, and therefore must be approved by Council ordinance.

Nothing should be controversial. This is a straightforward assignment of PHB funds allocated for this purpose to the existing contract. Failure to authorize this amendment would disrupt severe weather warming center operations.

 - Severe weather warming centers nightly shelter 150 300 people experiencing homelessness on nights on which forecasted weather conditions posed an immediate danger to the life and health of unsheltered people. They are the centerpiece of the City's standard operating procedures for the protection of unsheltered individuals during winter severe weather events.
 - This proposed amendment (Amendment 2) adds to the contract additional City general funds (\$50,000) previously allocated to PHB's FY 2010-11 budget for this purpose.
 - These funds will continue undisrupted FY2010-11 operations of Red Cross severe weather warming centers in accordance with existing contract conditions and City standard operating procedures for severe weather events.
