4. History of Agenda Item/Background:

The City of Portland Bureau of Planning and Sustainability's Green Building Program has implemented the ReTHINK educational series and the Build It Green! Tour of Homes and Information Fair for years to promote strategies that encourage green development in the region. Metro proposes to provide financial support for the City's programs because they are consistent with its solid waste and recycling objectives in the areas of construction and demolition debris recycling.

5. Purpose of Agenda Item:

Authorize intergovernmental agreement (IGA) with Metro to accept funds that support educational programs provided by bureau of Planning and Sustainability as part of its Green Building Program.

8 How Does This Relate to Current City Policies?

The activities to be funded by the agreements with the regional governments are consistent with Portland's Green Building Policy, as adopted by Resolution 35956 in 2001, updated in 2005 by Resolution 36310, and in 2009 by Resolution 36700; and with the City and County's Climate Action Plan, as adopted by Resolution 36748 in 2009.

9. Community Participation: Indirect. Hundreds of property owners and businesses have benefitted from the City's Green Building Program over the last decade.

10. Other Government Participation:

Metro, Clackamas, Multnomah, and Washington Counties are regional part. 3. The State's Department of Environmental Quality also partners in efforts to encourage recycling and reduce solid waste in the landfills in Oregon.

11. Financial Impact:

Metro will provide \$8,000 in FY 2010-11 to support the City's Green Building Program. The funds will be appropriated when this legislation is approved by City Council.
