BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

During the 2009 Oregon Legislative session, Senate Bill 479 was passed (unanimously) giving Oregon agencies and local government the authority to create contracting preference opportunities for disabled veterans and other related measures changing the Public Contracting Code found in ORS 279A, B and C. Based upon these changes, the City is amending the public contracting rules to conform to the new legislation. Additional housekeeping changes have also been included. The following is a synopsis of the changes for PCC 5.33:

- a. Authority for Golf Concession Contracts: Clarifies that concession contracts are not subject to the procurement methods otherwise provided in PCC Chapter 5.33.
- b. Authority for Stormwater Improvements: Provides the Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to execute contracts not to exceed \$200,000 for stormwater management improvement projects on private property consistent with Exhibit B when procured as a Special Procurement. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental services is authorized to execute amendments to those stormwater management improvement project agreements that do not amend the agreement amount to exceed \$200,000,
- c. Affirmative Action: Includes a provision for identifying a business enterprise that is owned or controlled by a disabled veteran as defined in ORS 408.225.

The substantive changes under 5.34 include:

- a. Affirmative Action: Includes a provision for identifying a business enterprise that is owned or controlled by a disabled veteran as defined in ORS 408.225.
- b. Emergency Contracts: Bidding and bonding Exemptions: Clarifies the emergency procurement source selection method and is changed to mirror the process under 5.33.
