BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

February 7, 2011

Organizational changes previously enacted in July, 2009 incorporating Procurement Services into the Bureau of Internal Business Services, Office of Management and Finance, have been incorporated within PCC 5.68. During the 2009 Oregon Legislative session, Senate Bill 479 was passed (unanimously) giving Oregon agencies and local government the authority to create contracting preference opportunities for disabled veterans and other related measures changing the Public Contracting Code found in ORS 279A, B and C. Based upon these changes, the City is amending the public contracting rules to conform to the new legislation. Additional housekeeping changes have also been included. The following is a synopsis of the changes for PCC 5.68:

- During the 2009 legislative session, the Oregon Legislature passed other legislation which included SB 479 making changes to state procurement laws giving Oregon agencies and local government the authority to create contracting preference opportunities for disabled veterans.
- b. The organizational changes previously enacted by the Office of Management and Finance have been incorporated within PCC 5.68. All references to "Purchasing Agent" have been changed to "Chief Procurement Officer" and likewise. references to the "Bureau of Purchases" have been changed to "Procurement Services".
