2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

The IGA outlines the project responsibilities between Metro and Portland Parks & Recreation in the design and construction of the Chimney Park-Pier Park Bicycle Pedestrian Bridge. The MTIP grant was awarded to Metro who will take the project management lead on the project. The bridge, once completed, will become the property of the City. Metro and Parks & Recreation staff will jointly mange the project.

Local contribution of \$220,000 from Parks SDC funds has been set aside for the grant match. This funding is in place.

Upon completion, the bridge will require on-going Operations and Maintenance funding. The final O&M estimate will be submitted with the project construction ordinance. At this time PPR recommends a \$20,000 annual O&M placeholder. Two of the larger concerns for the bridge, which crosses a railroad gap in an unpopulated area, are graffiti prevention and maintaining the integrity of the railroad-required security fencing.
