To the Citizens of Multnomah County:

Between now and May 15, 2011, Multnomah County, the City of Portland, and the City of Gresham (the *Consortium*) will be working on the **2011-2016 Consolidated Plan, the FY2011-2012 Action Plans**, and the **Fair Housing Plan**. These **Plans** will establish principles and priorities for spending federal, state, and local funds on affordable housing, community development, and the needs of the homeless. The **Fair Housing Plan** identifies impediments to Fair Housing Choice in Multnomah County, and lists recommendations for the *Consortium* to take to address those impediments.

Federal law requires that a set of the *draft Plans* be available for review at every public library within the Multnomah County Library system. This is a **Reference Set that includes drafts of the 2011-2016 Consolidated Plan, the FY 2011-2012 Action Plans for Multnomah County and the City of Gresham, and the Fair Housing Plan Executive Summary**. The City of Portland will be releasing its draft **FY2011-2012 Action Plan** for public comment in late April 2011; this draft will also be available in the libraries.
