- 4. **History of Agenda Item/Background**: The Bureau of Planning and Sustainability has entered into prior Intergovernmental Agreements with PSU to conduct studies of residential disposal weights. BPS uses this data for solid waste ratemaking purposes. By Ordinance 184331 passed by Council on January 5, 2011, the City amended Contract 3000595 through February 28, 2011, to cover changed scope of work and increased funding for additional work that was accomplished in 2010. The current new contract runs from 2011 through 2013.
