2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

The Consolidated Plan calls for the delivery of housing services that assist low-income citizens in accessing and retaining safe, affordable housing, including the Rent Well Tenant Education Program and the Landlord Guarantee Fund. This amendment will fund the Housing Authority of Portland (HAP) to improve the delivery of the Rent Well Tenant Education Program and administer the Landlord Guarantee Fund.

This proposed amendment (Amendment 1) adds to the contract additional General Fund (\$10,975) previously allocated in PHB's FY 2010-11 Budget.

The Consolidated Plan calls for the delivery of housing services that assist low-income citizens in accessing and retaining safe, affordable housing, including the Rent Well Tenant Education Program and the Landlord Guarantee Fund. This amendment will fund the Housing Authority of Portland (HAP) to improve the delivery of the Rent Well Tenant Education Program and administer the Landlord Guarantee Fund.

The Rent Well Tenant Education Program teaches people how to be responsible, stable tenants and is managed PHB and HAP. To improve delivery of this program, HAP (likely through a subcontractor) will lower the literacy level of the curriculum.

The Landlord Guarantee Fund is an incentive for landlords to rent to graduates of the Rent Well Tenant Education Program. The Guarantee provides a level of economic security to Landlords by covering unpaid rent, excessive damage, or eviction costs. HAP will negotiate terms and execute contract with Oregon Housing and Community Services (OHCS) for the Rent Well Landlord Guarantee Fund for Fiscal Year 2011-12. The contract with OHCS is currently held by PHB. Transfer of the contract directly to HAP will reduce administrative redundancies across agenc and reduce administrative costs to PHB.

The current proposed amendment adds FY 2010-11 allocations of General Fund dollars to fund the improved delivery of the Rent Well Tenant Education Program and to administer the Landlord Guarantee Fund.

Nothing should be controversial about this amendment. It furthers the City's goal of supporting programs that aid low-income Portlanders in accessing and retaining housing and increases administrative efficiency.

- This proposed amendment (Amendment 1) adds to the contract additional General Fund dollars (\$10,975) previously allocated in PHB's FY 2010-11 budget
