

ORDINANCE No. **184569**

\* Authorize application to U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, National Institute of Justice for a grant in the amount of \$172,383 for the FY 2011 Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grants Program (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The U.S. Department of Justice (USDOJ) Office of Justice Program (OJP), National Institute of Justice (NIJ) makes awards to states and units of local government to help improve the quality and timeliness of forensic science and medical examiner services;
2. The City of Portland, Oregon Police Bureau wishes to apply for USDOJ OJP National Institute of Justice grant funding;
3. The USDOJ OJP National Institute of Justice will reimburse the City a maximum of \$172,383 for expenses incurred by the Police Bureau for program equipment, supplies and training;
4. No match is required by this grant; and
5. The grant period is October 1, 2011, through September 30, 2012.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make application to USDOJ OJP NIJ for a grant in the amount of \$172,383, in a form substantially in accordance with the application attached as Exhibit A.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- c. The OMF Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay in proceeding with this application may result in not receiving funding. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
