## 1) Legislation Title:

\*Amend contract with Tetra Tech to provide additional technical services for the River Plan / North Reach and provide for payment (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 38089)

## 2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

The City Council unanimously adopted the River Plan/North Reach in April 2010. The Plan is currently under appeal but is expected to be presented to City Council for re-adoption once a new Economic Opportunities Analysis is adopted and any other legal issues are resolved.

The River Plan/North Reach requires mitigation for development and redevelopment activities that impact natural resources in the North Reach and directs the City to establish a fee in lieu and a mitigation bank. In November 2010, City Council heard testimony on a document that described how the City would implement the in lieu fees. Several issues were raised that need to be addressed.

This contract amendment will allow the City to refine the document "How to Calculate River Plan / North Reach In Lieu Fees" to address stakeholder concerns ands will allow the City to finalize the 30% design for the Swan Island Beaches restoration/mitigation site. A 30% pre-design will improve retoration cost estimates and bring the City closer to development of a mitigation bank. The Office of Healthy Working Rivers has approximately \$13,000 in contracting funds that they have been reserving for this type of River Plan / North Reach implementation.

- History of Agenda Item/Background:
  - On June 23, 2008, the City entered into a \$54,443.32 Professional, Technical and Expert (PTE) contract with Tetra Tech for professional services related to the River Plan / North Reach's River Restoration Program. The contract was amended on May 29, 2009 for \$13,600 for continued services including development of a crediting method. The contract was amended again on December 16, 2009 for \$25,000 using funds from the Bureaus of Planning and Sustainability and Environmental Services and the Office of Healthy Working Rivers to conduct continued work on the crediting system, the pricing system, and to help develop a City of Portland mitigation certification process. The contract was amended again on May 19, 2010 for \$100,000 to finalize the model to respond to direction from an independent science panel; finalize the cost recovery information that will serve as the basis for the in lieu fees; complete the mitigation banking prospectus and prepare portions of the mitigation banking instrument; and develop 30% design restoration plans for two mitigation sites.
- 5. Purpose of Agenda Item:
