ORDINANCE No. 184606

* Authorize a grant agreement with the Police Activities League of Greater Portland to create evening access to youth for recreational basketball during the months of summer vacation in 2011 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The City of Portland recognizes the need to address youth violence problems in a way that respects all members of the community and uses comprehensive, best-practice solutions.
- 2. The City of Portland recognizes that a large number of youth may be lacking productive programming and recreational activities during the time periods in which school is not in session.
- 3. The City of Portland recognizes the need for such activities due the closing of programs and places that provided youth with a safe, positive place to gather. Recognized also is that diminished resources have resulted in closure and or severe cutbacks in programs and services of grassroots community-based organizations that serve at risk youth.
- 4. To this end Mayor Sam Adams, Office of Youth Violence Prevention and the Portland Police Bureau through the newly formed Youth Services Division are committed to making resources available to at-risk youth in Portland for positive, structured and engaging activities during specified out-of-school times.
- 5. The Police Activities League of Greater Portland (PAL) was established in 1990 as a nonprofit corporation when concerned civic leaders, local citizens and law enforcement officers joined together to create solutions to the growing problem of gang involvement, and violence among youth.
- 6. In March of 2011 the PAL Youth Center hosted a Spring Break Extended Hour Program, funded through a small grant award offered by the City of Portland, which provided 159 largely Middle and High School aged youth structured recreation during 5 spring vacation evenings. The youth attending this program were largely considered at risk. 46% of youth attending qualified for Free or Reduced Lunch Program, 81% represented ethnic minority populations and 13% attended alternative schools and programs.
- 7. Through this grant agreement the PAL Youth Center, located at 424 NE 172nd Av. will be able to expand service hours again beyond 5:30 PM for 21 separate dates from the end of the current school year, June 14, 2011, through September of 2011.
- 8. Through this grant agreement male and female youth residing in Portland, ages 13 through 19 years old will gain access to an existing gymnasium specifically for recreational basketball during hours that the facility would normally have been closed. Minimally 70 youth per evening, based upon numbers of youth attending the previous program, will be provided recreation in a secure, safe and supervised environment.

9. Provided by this grant agreement will be access to the PAL Youth Center from 6:30 PM to 10 PM during 21 selected dates. Food and beverages will be provided. In kind staffing resources will be provided by the Portland Police Bureau through the Youth Services Division. Staffing and material expense allowances offered by this grant agreement are based upon the previously applied Spring Break Extended Hour Program Grant Budget.

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- 10. The Police Activities League and the City of Portland will sign a grant agreement that specifies the scope of the project to be conducted by the grantee and the schedule for fund disbursement. A sample grant agreement is attached as Exhibit A.
- 11. The amount of this grant is not to exceed \$16,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The City of Portland designates and authorizes the funding contained in this ordinance to be a grant. The Office of the Mayor is authorized, on behalf of the City, to enter into a Grant Agreement with the Police Activities League as substantially set forth in Exhibit A attached to this ordinance.
- b. The funds will come from the Office of Youth Violence Prevention funds currently administered by the Office of Mayor Sam Adams.
- c. The Mayor and Auditor are authorized to draw and deliver 1 check totaling \$16,000 to the Police Activities League, chargeable to the FY 2010-11 General Fund budget.

Section 2: The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay will jeopardize the timely execution of the award of the Grant Agreement to the Police Activities League of Great Portland, which may impact the Police Activities League's ability to deliver services required under this Grant; therefore, this Ordinance is in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
