#### EXHIBIT K: BUD CLARK COMMONS

### I. AUTHORITY

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One-time funding is available to support the opening of the Bud Clark Commons, a center that will provide housing placement, housing assistance, basic and support services to men, women and families experiencing homelessness in the City of Portland. The Bud Clark Commons meets the ending homelessness goals of the City of Portland. General Funds are available to support the opening of the Bud Clark Commons.

## II. SCOPE OF SERVICES

The name of the funded program is "Bud Clark Commons." Subrecipient will open and operate the Bud Clark Commons (BCC) starting on June 10, 2011, with one-time funding from the Portland Housing Bureau. Once fully opened and operational, the BCC will consist of three components: a) an Access Center, b) a 90-bed emergency shelter for men and c) 130 units of permanent supportive housing.

Funding will support the follow activities associated with the opening of the Bud Clark Commons and move of Transition Projects from their current location (475 NW Glisan Street, Portland OR) to the Bud Clark Commons (610 NW Broadway, between NW Hoyt and Irving):

- 1. Staff salaries for planning and training positions to the Bud Clark Commons (see Exhibit K-3)
- 2. Moving costs
- 3. Equipment expenses, including lease and/or purchase of office and other equipment for program operations
- 4. Rent and utility costs on Transition Projects' former 475 NW Glisan location, for the closing month of July 2011

The Access Center at the BCC will serve as a central gateway to services and housing for individuals and families experiencing homelessness in Portland. The Access Center will feature three programs to increase housing success and stability:

• **Connections Center**: Will provide basic needs and services, and improve connections to mainstream and targeted resources. Examples of services include, but are not limited to: SSD/SSDI application assistance, domestic violence counseling, re-entry services and bicycle maintenance and safety.

- Wellness Center: Will provide direct access to wellness and health information and resources. Examples of services include, but are not limited to: health information and referrals, foot checks and nail care, TB testing, and health education workshops.
- Learning Center: Will provide housing search and retention skills, opportunities for training and employment, and access to computers. Examples of services include, but are not limited to: GED support, adult literacy, housing search assistance, computer basics, employment forums and financial management workshops.

The Access Center will be open 7 days a week, 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM on Monday through Friday, and 8:00AM to 4:00PM on weekends. Services will be provided by Transition Projects in partnership with over a dozen on-site community partner agencies.
