## ORDINANCE No. 184721

\*Authorize the Director of the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability to enter into individual grant agreements with local jurisdictions and non-profit organizations for a total of \$41,000 to increase market demand for solar within Portland and select communities elsewhere in Oregon with grant funds from the U.S. Department of Energy (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds

- 1. Since 1990, with the passage of Ordinance 162975, the City has had a stated policy to "support environmentally acceptable, sustainable energy sources, especially renewable resources such as solar."
- 2. In 2007, with passage of Ordinance 181375, Council approved funding to the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability previously the Office of Sustainable Development for \$200,000 from the United States Department of Energy's Solar America Initiative Solar City Strategic Partnerships to fund activities to further the market expansion of solar within the City.
- 3. In 2010, with passage of Ordinance 183557, Council approved funding to the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability to accept Recovery Act funds from the U.S. Department of Energy for \$400,000 for the Neighborhood Solar Initiative, CFDA# 81.087.
- 4. The City's Bureau of Planning and Sustainability will administer up to \$41,000 in grant funding from the Neighborhood Solar Initiative to partner with up to six communities in amounts from \$5,000-\$10,000 to increase demand for solar energy within Portland and with select communities around the State of Oregon.
- 5. Funds have been appropriated in FY Budget 11-12 for Bureau of Planning and Sustainability in Cost Object PN00060004/217001.

## NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

a. The Director of the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability is hereby authorized to provide individual grants or contract agreements with local jurisdictions and not-for-profit organizations as described in 4 above. Funds are made available by the United States Department of Energy in accordance with specifications developed according to Exhibit A: Solar Now! Community Partnership Agreement.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay would unnecessarily delay the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the grant; therefore, this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
