7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

This ordinance will settle a lawsuit and cross claims between John Demarco, the City of Portland and property owner Corey Brunish. The case arose after Mr. DeMarco, an elderly gentleman tripped and fell on a tree well in the sidewalk outside of Mr. Brunish's property on SE Hawthorne Blvd.

After falling, Mr. Demarco required surgery and a stay in an assisted living facility incurring medical bills in the approximate amount of \$68,000. Mr. Demarco's attorney filed against Mr. Brunish as trustee for a trust that owns the adjacent property and the City of Portland alleging negligence. The property owner, represented by Brunish, and the City filed cross claims against each other.

After a mediation session with Judge Riggs, a tentative settlement was agreed upon in which both the city and Mr. Brunish would pay \$43,000 each to settle the claim and dismiss claims against each other. Both the City Attoney's office and Risk Management recommend settlement of this claim in this amount.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement would result in a payment of \$43,000 from the liability fund.

9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

Approve settlement of John Demarco bodily injury lawsuit in the sum of \$43,000.
