- 9) If "YES," please answer the following questions:
 - a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item? Fire Station 31 is located on the border between Portland and Gresham and has been jointly operated for the past 11 years. This engine company regularly responds into both Portland and Gresham. In addition, it responds to Clackamas County as a mutual aid unit on a semi-regular basis. The continuation of the seamless joint operation of the fire station is necessary to maintain appropriate response times throughout both communities it serves.
 - b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

PF&R specifically involved the Buddhist Temple, which adjoins Station 31, in the planning of this fire station and gained their support of the project. In addition Portland and Gresham jointly made outreach to the entire community and held a public awareness open house meeting to discuss the new station and its joint operation. PF&R personnel canvassed the neighborhoods surrounding the fire station by going door-to-door to invite everyone to an informational meeting and placed a large sign in front of the fire station advertising the meeting. At PF&R's request, PF&R and the City's project manager were invited to attend provide information and updates to the neighborhood association as the project moved forward. PF&R met with representatives from the Buddhist Temple to discuss the project at various times.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item? The surrounding neighborhoods were very supportive of the entire proposal, including the joint operation of the fire station, and testified at permitting hearings on behalf of both agencies.

- d) Who designed and implemented the public involvement related to this Council item? Jack Graham, Senior Business Operations Manager and Glen Eisner, Deputy Chief of Logistics designed and implemented the public involvement efforts. Chief Eisner actually participated in the door-to-door efforts by walking through the neighborhoods, inviting residents to attend the open house meetings, and discussing the project with those persons who asked questions.

7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Include:

-history of project – In July, 1999, the City entered into an agreement with the City of Gresham for the joint operation of Portland Fire Station 45, now renumbered to Station 31. This agreement was necessary for the efficient provisions of fire and emergency response services to an area that is on the border of both cities.

In 2007, the 1999 agreement was modified to change staffing to Portland providing staff for two 24-hour operational periods and Gresham providing staff for one 24-hour operational period.

In 2009, the agreement was modified to allow for the demolition and reconstruction of a station.

Demolition of the station began in the fall of 2010 and reconstruction is expected to be completed by July 1, 2011.

Although discussions began early, it took longer than expected to have the agreement approved by both parties City Attorneys.

Both cities would like to continue the joint operation of Station 31 in the new station. **-controversial issues** - none
