# 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

The Bureau of Planning and Sustainability (BPS) has requested a classification review for a position which manages sustainability research and innovation programs, oversees BPS sustainability policy development, contributes to the development and management of BPS policies and oversees the daily operations of the bureau. After a classification review, the Bureau of Human Resources determined that a new classification of Planning and Sustainability Policy, Research and Operations Manager should be created to properly classify this work. We are recommending a nonrepresented salary range 14 for the new classification.

This position will be responsible for exercising independent judgment in the formulation of policies that have citywide impact or importance and will be excluded from the classified service as provided by the City Charter and Human Resources Administrative Rules.

## 8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

There is no direct cost to create this classification. A current limited term position will be reclassified to the new classification. That position is currently a nonrepresented grade 12 and the new classification is a nonrepresented grade 14, which has a maximum rate that is \$22,734 higher.
