a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

This Council item is in support of an earlier IGA adopted by Council that accepted grant funding for the project. The project will reconstruct sidewalks to improve pedestrian access, circulation and safety within the commercial core of the Lents Town Center. Construction of the project requires the acquisition of additional public right-of-way. This current IGA allows the project to complete the right-of-way phase per federal guidelines.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

The project initiated a plan refinement phase, funded by the Portland Development Commission, to identify implementation priorities and to refine specific design issues associated with the concept plan contained within the 2000 Lents Town Center Business District Transportation Plan. The Portland Development Commission established a citizen's advisory committee to help guide this process and develop the final recommendations to the Lents Town Center Urban Renewal District Advisory Committee for final endorsement. The citizen's advisory committee was composed of business and community representatives from the urban renewal district. The committee met 5 times to develop a recommendation along with a public open house event. The Lents Neighborhood Association and the Lents Town Center Urban Renewal District Advisory Committee were regularly updated on the progress of the process.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

Public involvement only indirectly shaped the outcome of this Council item. The process noted above provided the general design directives for implementation of the streetscape project, which included the need for acquisition of public right-of-way. This Council item is a prerequisite for using federal funds in the overall project that involves right-of-way acquisition.

d) Who designed and implemented the public involvement related to this Council item?

Public involvement for the project was a partnership between the Bureau of Transportation (Rich Newlands) and the Portland Development Commission (Sue Lewis).
