## ORDINANCE No.

Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with Clackamas Co. Service District #1 for construction of sanitary sewers and cost-sharing of common facilities (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Bureau of Environmental Services ("BES") has constructed a sanitary sewer system [the Lents Sewer Extension Project (SEP) #E06954] roughly SE 82<sup>nd</sup> to I-205 to serve City properties south to the boundary between the City and the Clackamas County Service District #1 ("District".) SE Clatsop St., which is the City/District boundary in this area, includes a sewer line that could also serve 28 District properties on the south side of SE Clatsop.
- 2. The District has constructed a sanitary sewer system as part of its North Clackamas Revitalization Area ("NCRA") in the area of SE 55<sup>th</sup> 58<sup>th</sup> Aves. directly south of the City/District boundary in this area. The District offered to extend its sanitary sewer system to provide service to 14 unsewered properties within the City just north of their project.
- 3. The most efficient, cost effective and non-duplicative extension of sewer system facilities entails sharing of facilities and costs between the City and the District.
- 4. The estimated costs of the Lents SEP (including overhead charges) that are allocable to the District are roughly \$285,000. The estimated cost for the District to extend the sewer into the City, and share in costs of common facilities, is roughly \$228,000. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY2011-12 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, WBS Element #E10123.

## NOW, THEREFORE, the council directs:

- a. The Commissioner of Public Affairs is authorized to execute the attached Intergovernmental Agreement between the District and City for the purpose described in Section 1.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.
- c. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to invoice the District according to the methodology contained within the agreement based on actual costs incurred, including all direct and indirect overhead charges allocated to BES capital projects.
