Approximately 250 underserved and at risk youth ages 9 – 16 will be able to attend a 4 week summer camp program located on the PSU campus. All participants will receive two hot meals, 1 hour swim instruction, 1 hour classroom education per day in addition to recreation and athletic programming.

PAL program participants, HAP, Boys & Girls Club participants, school districts, etc. Their input is solicited throughout the year to improve programming, to make programming more accessible across the City and to address community concerns and needs.


