AMENDMENT TO CITIES OF PORTLAND AND GRESHAM, AND MULTNOMAH COUNTY CONSOLIDATED ANNUAL ACTION PLAN FOR FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2010-2011 TO INCORPORATE FUNDING AND ACTIVITIES UNDER A GRANT TO REHABILITATE 5 UNITS FOR HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES FOR PERSONS WITH AIDS (HOPWA).

TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND PERSONS:

The City of Portland proposes to amend its Consolidated Plan Action Plan FY 2010-2011 as follows:

The City intends to use federal funds from the Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) program to fund the maintenance and operating costs, including carpet replacement and relocation costs of an adult foster care facility (5 units) located in Milwaukie, Oregon by allocating \$9,090 (HOPWA) to the non-profit agency, Northwest Housing Alternatives. The units will serve individuals with incomes at or below 80% of the area median income. The purpose of this notice is to provide an opportunity for public comment on this amendment and the proposed amendment to the cities Portland and Gresham, Multnomah County Consolidated Plan One-Year Action Plan for FY2010-2011.

The Consolidated Plan is a requirement of HUD as a condition of receiving certain federal funding. The Plan identifies the City of Portland, City of Gresham, and Multnomah County overall needs for affordable and supportive housing, homeless shelters and services for community and economic development, and for building public and private partnerships. The proposed program modification utilizing HOPWA funding will have no adverse impact on any projects and activities already a part of the One-Year Action for FY 2010-2011. The provision of this opportunity for comment is in accordance the City of Portland, City of Gresham, and Multnomah County Consolidated Plan for substantive amendment to the Consolidated Plan.
