* Accept a grant in the amount of \$648,238 and appropriate \$599,339 for FY 2011-12 from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance FY11 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program to prevent or reduce crime and violence (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The City applied to the U.S. Department of Justice (USDOJ), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) for the FY11 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program on July 19, 2011; and
- 2. The USDOJ OJP BJA has notified the City that it will award a grant for the FY11 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program to the City in the amount of \$648,238; and
- 3. The USDOJ will reimburse the City a maximum of \$648,238 for program expenses incurred by the Police Bureau and its joint applicants Multnomah County and the City of Gresham; and
- 4. Intergovernmental Agreements have been executed with Multnomah County and the City of Gresham in order to obligate agency roles and responsibilities and define sub-recipient responsibilities; and
- 5. The grant period is October 1, 2010, through September 30, 2014; and
- 6. No match is required by this grant.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland a grant from USDOJ OJP BJA for the FY11 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program in the amount of \$648,238.
- b. The FY 2011-12 budget is hereby amended as follows: <u>GRANTS FUND</u> Fund - 217 Business Area - PL00 Bureau Program Expenses - \$599,339

- c. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.
- d. The Chief of the Police Bureau of the City of Portland is authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland any subsequent modifications by the USDOJ for the FY11 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program, #2011-DJ-BX-2656, provided such modifications do not increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by the Portland City Council.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay would unnecessarily delay the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the grant. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
