ORDINANCE No. 184868

Extend the Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Consensus-National Policy Consensus Center, Portland State University to December 31, 2011 to assess issues related to sedimentation and the need for maintenance dredging in Portland rivers (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 30002174)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The public interest of the citizens of the City of Portland and the health of the Willamette and Columbia Rivers are served by a better understanding of issues related to sedimentation and the impacts on watershed health and public and private users of the river;
- 2. The Office of Healthy Working Rivers (OHWR) Advisory Committee identified difficulties in performing necessary maintenance dredging due to sediment build up that affects public and private uses of the river including marinas, boat ramps, City park facilities, and floating homes. Dredging of sediment is subject to regulatory requirements and management and disposal of dredged materials may be expensive.
- 3. Portland State University through Oregon Consensus, has the ability to assess the potential impacts to the City and private river owners to determine the extent of the issue, costs associated with maintenance dredging, permitting issues and to make recommendations to OHWR on opportunities to resolve issues. Oregon Consensus is a neutral entity that is well respected for this type of assessment.
- 4. The City entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Consensus, Portland State University, in June 2011 to provide a report identifying key issues related to sedimentation and maintenance dredging and recommendations for possible next steps to resolve key issues identified in the assessment process Ordinance No. 184516).
- 5. Oregon Consensus sought comments from key stakeholders on draft assessment tools and has completed many of the tasks in the Scope of work. Additional time to respond to stakeholder input necessitates extending the completion date of this project.
- 6. The City and Oregon Consensus now desire to amend and extend the terms of the current agreement and work plan to extend the completion date of this project from July 30, 2011 to December 31, 2011.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. That the Commissioner-in Charge and Auditor are authorized to sign an amendment to the intergovernmental agreement with Oregon Consensus, Portland State University to extend the agreement until December 31, 2011 substantially similar to that attached as Exhibit A to this ordinance.
