Amendment to extend the Office of Healthy Working River's Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Consensus-National Policy Consensus Center, Portland State University (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 30002174)

Requested Council Hearing Date: September 7, 2011 Consent Agenda – Non-Emergency Item

I. RECOMMENDATION

Authorize an amendment to extend Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Consensus-National Policy Consensus Center, Portland State University to December 31, 2011 to assess issues related to sedimentation and the need for maintenance dredging in Portland's rivers.

II. BACKGROUND

This project was identified as a priority by members of the Office of Healthy Working Rivers' (OHWR) Advisory Committee. Members reported that sediment in the river builds up and impacts public and private uses of the river including marinas, boat ramps, park facilities and floating homes. Dredging of sediment is subject to regulatory requirements and management and disposal of dredged materials may be expensive. It is critical for watershed health that dredging and dredge material disposal be conducted in a manner that minimizes any environmental impact.

The Council approved Ordinance 184516 authorizing OHWR to enter into an agreement with Oregon Consensus – Portland State University to provide an independent assessment of the nature and extent of issues related to maintenance dredging. The assessment will be the basis for a report with recommendations to the OHWR and the Advisory Committee.

At OHWR's request, Oregon Consensus has involved key stakeholders in the design of a survey that will serve as a key assessment tool. This effort, including on-going discussions with stakeholders and OHWR Staff has taken more time than was anticipated in the initial project scope of work. To allow Oregon Consensus the time to respond to comments and revise their assessment tools accordingly, we proposed extending the date for final work produce submittal from July 30, 2011 to December 31, 2011. No additional funds will be added to the Intergovernmental Agreement.
