PHB staff may attend a monthly neighborhood association meeting to share more information and to ask for the neighborhood's assistance in advertising the benefits of the program to households who are presently renting in the neighborhood.

PHB will implement the program with the assistance of its community partners which include:

- Native American Youth and Family Center
- African American Alliance for Homeownership
- Portland Community Reinvestment Initiatives
- Hacienda Community Development Corporation
- Portland Housing Center

PHB will ask these partner organizations to target outreach to historically underserved populations in order to meet its equity goals.

In addition to the specific groups mentioned above, PHB has sought extensive public involvement in the development of its Five Year Consolidated Plan and its Annual Action Plan that includes homebuyer services.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

Public involvement helped shape PHB's strategic plan which in turn shaped the program guidelines, specifically the emphasis on low-income households and targeting outreach to historically underserved populations.

The PHB Neighborhood Housing Program team conducted community outreach for the program, and the Equity, Planning, and Communications team was responsible for the extensive public input around the Consolidated Plan and the Action plan.
