Guilds Lake Pump Station is located in an isolated area within the Guilds Lake Industrial Area. It is bordered on the west side by the railroad, on the south side by an unimproved street, and by vacant City of Portland properties on the north and east sides. The nearest neighbor is Wacker Siltronic, which is about ¼ mile away. Railroad operations and Wacker Siltronic access will not be affected by the construction project.

The improvements to the pump station will be constructed mostly within the existing fenced site, and inside the existing structure.



Station Improvements, Project No. E08877 (Ordinance)

I. RECOMMENDATION

Authorize the Commissioner of Public Utilities and Auditor to execute a contract with the lowest responsible bidder for the construction of the Guilds Lake Pump Station Improvements, Project No. E08877.

II. BACKGROUND

The remodel of the Guilds Lake Pump Station has been identified as a priority project within the BES Pump Station Improvement Program due to equipment condition and age: to address safety, reliability, and maintenance access issues; and to comply with current regulatory requirements. Improvements include, but are not limited to:

- Installation of temporary pumping system and erosion control during construction.
- Wholesale demolition of existing electrical, instrumentation and controls (I&C), lighting, plumbing, and mechanical (sewage pumping) systems. Partial demolition of HVAC systems. Demolition of seismically unsound ground floor partitions.
- New electrical power distribution, I&C, and lighting systems upgrades, including onsite emergency generator and fuel tank for back-up power.
- New sewage pumping system and reconnection to existing 20- and 30-inch forcemain, including isolation valve and pigging/temporary pump-around port connection for the 20-inch forcemain.
- New plumbing system for washdown and future seal water system.
- New HVAC fans to reuse most of the existing ductwork.
- Construction of concrete pad and shelter for the new generator, fuel tank, and associated electrical equipment.
- New ground floor partitions for remodeled restroom and I&C Room.
- New energy star reflective roof.

- New OSHA compliant guard- and handrails. New removable chain rails around 8 4 8 9 7 hatch and grate openings.
- New access ladders and roof tie-off points.
- Structural repairs and improvements to existing structure.
- Installation of AC driveway and vegetated swale for stormwater treatment.
- Landscaping.
- Painting of interior and exterior walls, and equipment.

III. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The estimated cost is \$2,600,000. Confidence in cost estimate is Optimal. The level of confidence in the estimated construction cost is Optimal. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2011-2012 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, Project No. E08877.

IV. LEGAL ISSUES

No legal issues have been identified.

V. CONTROVERSIAL ISSUES

No controversial issues have been identified.

VI. LINK TO CURRENT CITY POLICIES

The project is consistent with BES strategic planning and the CIP process. Construction will be performed in accordance with the latest revision of the City of Portland Standard Construction Specifications, and in accordance with the requirements and conditions of the commercial building permit, which has been issued.

VII. CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

Not applicable due to project's location.

VIII. OTHER GOVERNMENT PARTICIPATION

Coordination with Procurement Services will be required during the bid and award phase of this project.

BES has acquired the Commercial Building Permit from the Bureau of Development Services prior to construction.

Coordination will be required with the Bureau of Parks and Recreation for on-site landscaping when construction is completed.

The Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) requires a submittal of the plans and specifications for their review and Conditional Approval. The approval was received on June 24, 2011.
