Statement before the Portland City Council • November 30, 2006
Herman M. Frankel, M.D.

Mayor Potter, and Commissioners Leonard, Adams, Sten, and Saltzman:

My name is Herman M. Frankel, M.D.

Thank you for this “Resolution Urging Cessation of Combat Operations in Iraq and the Return of US Troops.” [With you, I am grateful to the men and women deployed in Iraq, in a tragic war authorized by the US Congress on the basis of subsequently disproved claims by the President of “imminent threat of attack by Iraq, possession of weapons of mass destruction by Saddam Hussein, and the role of Saddam Hussein in the 9/11 attacks on the United States.” With you, I honor the Americans and Iraqis who have lost their lives, and those who have been permanently devastated, in this ill-conceived and unlawful invasion, occupation, and destruction of a sovereign nation. I support you in calling for an orderly and rapid withdrawal of United States military personnel from Iraq, the dismantling of U.S. military bases in Iraq, the relinquishing of control of Iraq's economy, the provision of necessary financial compensation and resources for Iraqis to rebuild Iraq, and a redirection of the financial resources used to prosecute the war to address the urgent needs of the most vulnerable portions of our population, including education, health care, and full benefits for returning veterans.]

I will add an additional matter of great concern to those that you have enumerated so compellingly in this Resolution.

I think it is no accident that in the climate of bullying and contempt that has affected our nation in the era of the USA PATRIOT Act and the invasion and occupation of Iraq, the people of Portland have become increasingly distressed by abuses of power in all aspects of our lives. We are deeply pained by discrimination on the basis of race, religion, color, gender, national origin, age, mental or physical disability, sexual orientation, gender identity, income level, marital status, immigrant status, refugee status; by secret police arrests and detention of such area residents as Brandon Mayfield; by the deaths at traffic stops or in custody of Kendra James (05/05/03), James Jahar Perez (03/28/04), and Jim-Jim Chasse (09/17/06); by assaults on civil rights and human rights in our courts and workplaces and streets; and, perhaps the most hidden and most common of all, by domestic violence in our homes.

I express again my gratitude for your unanimous passage, on October 18, 2006, of a Resolution to establish a City of Portland Metropolitan Human Relations Commission, and a Resolution affirming commitment to the inclusion of immigrants and refugees in civic and public life. Even as we work together to end the violence committed in our name in places far away from here, we affirm our commitment to work together to make Portland a community in which all people can live in dignity, without fear of discrimination, of abuse, of violence.

Thank you again for your courage, your integrity, and your vision. We are inspired by your leadership.

Mayor Potter, Commissioner Leonard and other members of Council

The Peace and Justice Works Iraq Affinity Group is pleased to speak in support of the resolution you have before you today. Our work for nearly 15 years has been focused on ending the suffering of the people of Iraq that is caused by U.S. foreign policy. It is clear in this resolution -- as it has become clear to most of the world -- that the U.S. invasion and occupation of Iraq is merely making matters worse for people who lived for decades under a dictatorship, for 13 years under the most restrictive sanctions regime in history, and whose people have been harmed or killed by US bombs throughout the 1990s and most seriously in the U.S. attacks in 1991 and 2003.

We are particularly grateful that in addition to the casualties of US service men and women the resolution acknowledges the devastating estimated totals of Iraqis killed in the invasion and its aftermath.

We have been working closely with the American Friends Service Committee on this effort for many months and I want to just highlight a few important developments.

First, thank you to Commissioner Leonard who was not afraid to tell the community in the fall of 2003 that he felt he had been duped by the administration to support the invasion of Iraq, using the phrase, "fool me once, shame on you, fool me twice, shame on me" and "if I knew then what I know now..." he would not have voted against the January 2003 resolution opposing the invasion.

Second, it is notable that the voices who strongly urged the Council not to pass that resolution have fallen silent. Back then, the Oregonian and the Portland Business Alliance challenged the reasons why the City should worry about international affairs. However, this resolution makes it clear that all politics are local. Furthermore, we have been able to garner the support of a wide variety of community organizations, many of whom you have heard from today, elected officials, and even a few businesses. There are a total of 50 names of groups, individuals and businesses who endorsed the resolution and had the timeline not accelerated so quickly we're sure there could be many more.

Third, it is about time that Portland took this stand. Looking at the 163 or more other troops home resolutions which have passed in various municipalities around the country, we can see that the other major cities who have passed resolutions already include Chicago, Philadelphia, San Francisco, Baltimore, and even Kalamazoo, Michigan. But it wasn't until February of this year that Corvallis became the first city in Oregon to pass such a resolution.

One of the endorsers of today's resolution who couldn't be here, State Senator Avel Gordly, asked me to share with you that she will be working with others including Rep. Shields on such a resolution for the state legislature when it convenes in January.

By the way, if the resolution passes today, it will make Portland the 6th largest city in the nation to do so.*

We hope that by passing this, the Council is truly committed to forwarding its sentiments to the Governor, the legislature, and all of Oregon's elected officials. It is far past time for the country as a whole to call to bring the troops home, and with President Bush talking just today of sending more troops to Iraq, the resolution can't be more timely.

Thank you again.

*Behind Chicago (#3), Philadelphia (#5), San Francisco (#14), Baltimore (#18), and Milwaukee (#22), Portland is #30 in population. It is ahead of Sacramento (#37), Oakland (#44) and other cities not in the top 50 most populous.

I write in support of your resolution urging President Bush to bring our troops home from Iraq. I have opposed the war in Iraq from the beginning. I fought against the resolution authorizing the President to lead our country to war because I knew that while the brave men and women of our military were prepared to defeat Saddam Hussein's forces, the administration and congressional leaders were never prepared to win the peace.

I am deeply troubled that my early fears have proven correct. The administration has made the wrong military, political, and diplomatic choices at every turn. Not only has this weakened our military and our ability to be a force for good in the world, but the administration's spectacular failures have hurt our ability to fight terrorism, and left America with no good options in Iraq.

A Resolution of the Democratic Party of Clackamas County

WHEREAS America stands in her best moments as a tribute to individual and collective optimism of her people; and

WHEREAS as Americans, we recognize that our cherished freedoms are dependent upon our national security; and

WHEREAS a nation is defined not only by its past but by current events as well, the latter are not static and must be seen in the context of time; and whereas events deemed as justified and necessary in one day's time may, in the light of days to come, be seen as empty, indefensible, and threatening to our national security; and

WHEREAS a stark and horrible instance of such an event is the present Iraqi war and occupation. With a deceitful and reprehensible rationale, our government officials marched us into this unnecessary and disgraceful conflict as one might lead a trusting blind man to a cliff. Today these same duplicitous officials offer neither a real explanation nor an honest appraisal of our efforts thus far; and

WHEREAS when faced with the genuine, patriotic concerns of faithful and loyal Americans, these same officials respond with yet more wrongful deception, suggesting we are mindlessly aiding and abetting an enemy of convenient definition; and

WHEREAS the costs of the Iraqi war and occupation are catastrophic, at present including but not limited to (1) treasure in excess of 250 million dollars each day, (2) nearly 3,000 American lives, over 10,000 American wounded and maimed, and hundreds of thousands of innocent civilian lives, and (3) the deterioration of our country's prestige among our friends and allies great and small throughout the world; and

WHEREAS America's national security requires an honest foreign policy, not a treacherous and false pretext for the perpetuation of the Iraqi war and occupation,

Therefore be it Resolved That:

1. The Democratic Party of Clackamas County is opposed to the continued war and occupation of Iraq.
2. The Democratic Party of Clackamas County encourages its candidates and elected officials to take active and visible involvement in the international peace movement.
3. The Democratic Party of Clackamas County will actively support candidates who take a clear position against the occupation of Iraq.

closely aligned with the United States. Elsewhere, the United States' "tough talk" toward Syria has led the Israeli government to warn that U.S. actions threaten to destabilize the region. The massive number of civilian casualties in Iraq are caused by heavy weapon attacks and flesh-burning compounds such as white phosphorus, particularly devastating in urban areas. Such attacks greatly damage U.S. credibility and political influence in the Middle East, as well as respect from the international community. The many U.S. bases in Iraq are seen as a long-term threat to the region and the future of Iraq. They should be removed when the troops leave.

9. Humanitarian aid is crippled by the occupation.

The U.S. military seeks to win Iraqis' support by delivering food and medicine and implementing reconstruction projects. Such activities are also used to gather intelligence, blurring the lines between the military and humanitarian efforts. As a result, civilian humanitarian aid is confused with military-led operations, creating the misperception that relief workers are part of the occupying forces and a legitimate target. These conditions have forced almost all NGOs and UN agencies to leave. Coupled with lack of progress by the U.S. military in rebuilding Iraq, this severs the lifeline of international humanitarian aid to Iraqis. Ending the U.S. occupation would reduce tensions and clear the way for humanitarian organizations to support Iraqis in rebuilding their country.

10. The global community wants the war and occupation to end now.

The United States cannot afford to ignore the voices and sentiments of the many other countries that oppose the occupation. Bridges need to be rebuilt between the United States and the international community. The past three years show that unilateral militarism, with disregard for our allies, leads to isolation and failure. Iraq needs political and diplomatic support from the international community—including its immediate neighbors—to get back on its feet and keep peace internally and externally.

The U.S. decision to invade and occupy Iraq comes with a horrific price tag: deaths of an estimated 100,000 Iraqis and more than 2,345 occupation troops, including 2,140 U.S. military personnel. The numbers rise daily. Hundreds of thousands have been physically wounded or traumatized by chronic violence and insecurity. This path will not lead to victory. There are no winners, and there is no military solution. In spite of this, the U.S. continues to embrace military rather than diplomatic approaches. An immediate end to hostilities is essential to stem the carnage and loss of human life.

2. The U.S. occupation is a catalyst for violence.

The longer the U.S. occupation continues, the more Iraqis will join the resistance, which primarily opposes the foreign presence. Conservative estimates say the number of resistance fighters in Iraq increased from 5,000 in November 2003 to 20,000 in November 2005. Violence is aggravated at all levels by the U.S. presence: in neighborhoods, among militant extremists, and between ethnic groups. When the brutality of occupation — raiding homes and hospitals, detaining people without charge or due process, torturing detainees, imposing curfews on communities, using military force to suppress demonstrations — ends, the majority of resisters will lay down their weapons.

3. U.S. actions inflame divisions and the chance of civil war.

The occupation and its divisive policies deepen tensions within Iraqi society. Three major mistakes the United States made from the beginning of the occupation were: (1) dissolution of the Iraqi army and police, leading to insecurity, looting, and violence; (2) failure to dismantle militias, allowing the number of armed combatants to increase; and (3) support for Shi'a demands for regional autonomy, fueling the possibility of a break-up of the country along ethnic lines. Problems from these mistakes will continue as long as the United States controls Iraq politically and militarily. If U.S. troops leave, an independent Iraqi government, free of external control, could open the door to discussion and reconciliation between groups.

4. Iraqis want the United States to leave now.

Recent polls reveal that Iraqi opinion coalesces on four demands: (1) an end to foreign occupation, (2) compensation to Iraqis for damages caused by the U.S. invasion, (3) release of Iraqi prisoners, and (4) establishment of political and military institutions independent of outside influences. A survey in Iraq commissioned by the British military in September 2005 found that 82 percent of Iraqis "strongly oppose" the continuing presence of coalition troops, and 45 percent feel attacks against coalition troops are justified. The battle for hearts and minds has been lost.

5. Democracy cannot flourish under an occupation.

For Iraqis, the key issues in the December 2005 election for the first permanent government were security, economic opportunity, and removal of foreign occupation. The mechanics of voting worked — the third election for Iraqis during 2005. However, the election is only a milestone in the country's difficult journey toward self-determination, with great challenges ahead. The new government must now move beyond artificial deadlines set by outsiders, determine its own goals, and see the process through.

6. The United States has failed to rebuild Iraq or provide for Iraqis' basic needs.

Twelve years of economic sanctions (1991-2003) nearly crippled Iraq. Malnutrition became widespread. Life-sustaining systems such as water and sewage treatment, electricity, and health care were severely degraded. These problems led to deaths of hundreds of thousands of Iraq's most vulnerable citizens, many of them children. Since the beginning of the occupation, U.S. forces not only failed to reverse these trends, but also failed to restore services disrupted by war and looting. This is not due to a lack of funds, but to a perversion of priorities. While the United States spends \$6 billion a month fighting the war (a total of more than \$226 billion so far), it has not spent even half of the \$18 billion allocated for reconstruction. Much of the money evaporates due to corruption and ballooning security costs. Plus, awarding major contracts to U.S. corporations who fail to complete their work takes money out of the economy and creates little benefit to Iraqis. The money that is spent on war and occupation should be spent on meaningful Iraqi-led reconstruction.

7. The Iraq war and occupation waste resources needed for U.S. domestic programs.

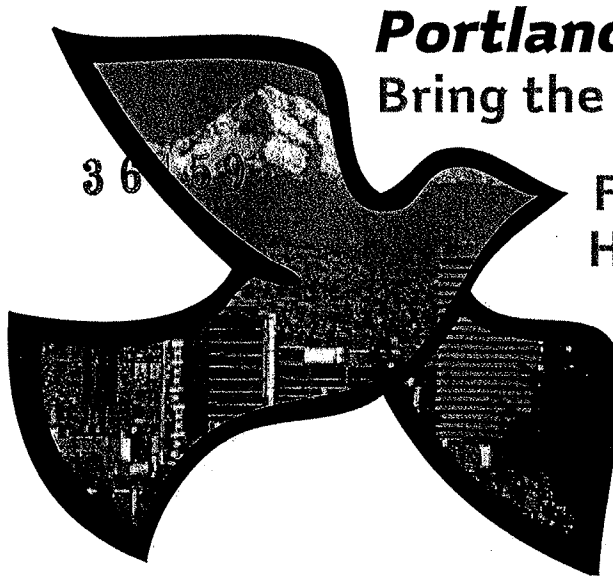
Community programs are being cut in every corner of the United States — from public schools to libraries to hospitals to transportation. Meanwhile, the U.S. deficit continues to skyrocket, building a massive debt for future generations of Americans. Money that could be used for domestic needs instead goes into the war and occupation. Furthermore, using National Guard troops in Iraq leaves states shorthanded when disasters strike at home. Hurricane Katrina, in particular, highlighted the need for massive reallocation of resources from armaments into disaster preparedness and infrastructure at home.

8. The U.S. occupation of Iraq destabilizes the Middle East.

The rash, ill-advised, and nearly unilateral invasion of Iraq and subsequent U.S. occupation has profoundly damaged the United States' relations with other Middle East governments, including those it considers to be allies. U.S. actions have galvanized militants in the region to join the insurrection in Iraq and attack other countries, such as Jordan, considered to be too

Dear Portland City Council Commissioners,

I write to urge your adoption of a resolution that would "immediately commence an orderly and rapid withdrawal of United States military personnel from Iraq, dismantle U.S. military bases in Iraq, relinquish control of Iraq's economy and provide the necessary financial compensation and resources for Iraqis to rebuild Iraq".

I urge your support for the following reasons:

CONGRESS HAS FAILED US

The current partisan, do-nothing Congress has abdicated its constitutional duty to perform real oversight on behalf of its citizens. Had they done so, the lies we were told to gain support for the invasion of Iraq would have been revealed and George W. Bush would have been shown to lack authorization to invade Iraq because he failed to comply with the requirement the Joint Resolution of Congress to secure a second Security Council resolution.

Because Congress failed initially and still does not fully oversee the conduct of this illegal war, it is incumbent on all American citizens to appeal to our elected representatives at all levels of government to speak on our behalf and to make it unequivocally clear to the Bush administration that we are not all right with having been lied into a war; that we are not all right with having had our fears and our patriotism manipulated to serve ill-defined goals; that we are not all right with having our sons and daughters dragged into a conflict without proper equipment, without proper planning and with no exit strategy.

THE WAR IS ENDANGERING OUR ECONOMY

The misguided war in Iraq is bleeding our national treasury dry at an unprecedented rate of \$5.6 billion per month, diverting resources that are desperately needed to solve current domestic problems here at home and saddling future generations with a level of debt that amounts to a "birth tax" levied on every American child born today, robbing them of the resources to solve the domestic problems of the future.

Continuing to finance this reckless policy through debt, not only diverts a huge portion of our nation's treasure to international financial institutions in the form of interest payments, but also increases the leverage of foreign dollar holders over future policy and national security decisions. With the deficit now exceeding six percent of GDP, the value of the dollar continues to weaken.

THE WAR HAS WEAKENED NATIONAL SECURITY

Contrary to the administration's claims that invading Iraq would make us safer, exactly

the opposite has happened. According to the U.S. National Intelligence Council, the Iraq war has created, "a training and recruitment ground (for terrorists), and an opportunity for terrorists to enhance their technical skills." The International Institute for Strategic Studies reports that the war's net effect on al Qaeda has been "accelerated recruitment". Our pre-emptive invasion of a country that did not pose an imminent threat to us has created widespread animosity around the world and buttressed the stereotype of a bully nation that has no respect for other peoples and no real interest in justice.

As was predicted by those who opposed the war originally, we now find ourselves caught in the middle of a civil war that threatens the stability of the entire Middle East and makes conflict in many other places more likely. Refugees from Iraq are crossing over into neighboring countries at an increasing rate.

THE WAR HAS WEAKENED OUR MILITARY

Stretching our national military and our national guard to their limits reduces our readiness to handle unexpected emergencies - whether natural or manmade. The cost of having over 6,000 National Guardsmen stationed from Mississippi and Louisiana far overseas in Iraq certainly hampered a quick response to the horrific aftermath of hurricane Katrina.

THE ORIGINAL JUSTIFICATIONS FOR WAR WERE LIES

In October 2002, the United States Congress adopted a Joint Resolution to authorize the use of United States Armed Forces in Iraq on the basis of imminent threat of attack by Iraq, possession of weapons of mass destruction by Saddam Hussein and the role of Saddam Hussein in the 9/11 attacks on the United States, all of which have subsequently been disproved.

THE WAR CANNOT BE WON BY THE U.S. MILITARY AND THERE WILL BE NO PEACE IN IRAQ UNTIL WE LEAVE

Our troops have been tasked with an impossible mission, because the war cannot be won by us militarily. Since May 2003, our military has been an occupation force in Iraq. After successfully toppling the existing government of Saddam Hussein in the spring of 2003, they have been tasked with an impossible mission – to create a democracy from scratch, rebuild a national infrastructure and maintain peace in a foreign country fraught with sectarian hatreds. Our troops were not deployed for nor trained for such a mission and not unpredictably now find themselves in the middle of a civil war, trying to keep the warring parties from annihilating each other.

Even a cursory review of history - both the history of Iraq, of foreign occupiers in Iraq, and of how democracies are formed – showed that Bush's policy of creating a democracy out of whole cloth at the barrel of a gun was doomed from the start.

The presence of a foreign occupier inevitably breeds resistance. Our military presence in Iraq does not dampen the resistance, but fuels it and only an end to the occupation will end that resistance and leave the Iraqis free to determine their own future. Like people everywhere, Iraqis do not want to live under foreign occupation, yet George W. Bush refuses to commit to any "exit strategy" whatsoever or to say that U.S. troops will ever completely withdraw. This is a recipe for never-ending violence, not stability.

The divisions between Sunni and Shiite Muslims are not being lessened by our occupation. Leaders in these communities condemn sectarian violence, but they cannot successfully negotiate their differences as long as the U.S. military holds ultimate power. Iraqis want their country back and an end to our occupation is a prerequisite for peace and the rebuilding of the country.

Ending the occupation means completely withdrawing all U.S. troops, all coalition troops, and all mercenaries ("private military contractors") from Iraq. Ending occupation also means closing all U.S. military bases in Iraq, and removing all warplanes and offensive weapons systems. The privatization and other outside economic controls imposed on Iraq by the United States, the World Bank, and the International Monetary Fund must also end if Iraqis are to fully control their own country. A responsible end to occupation must also include negotiating our post-war obligations, a reckoning of what is owed the Iraqi people in reconstruction. This time it must be a reconstruction designed and implemented by Iraqis, not by U.S. companies and corporate war profiteers.

Once we leave, Iraqis will have to come to terms with each other and find their own way to peace. The legitimate resistance of Iraq will then be free to also deal with and expel any other foreign forces, such as al Qaeda. This is what happened in Vietnam when we left that country and it will not happen in Iraq until we leave.

We're going to have to leave eventually for there to be any real peace or reconciliation in Iraq. Our withdrawal should begin now rather than later. This is not the time to be contemplating sending yet more U.S. troops into the middle of a civil war.

WE MUST MAKE THE BEST END POSSIBLE TO A TRAGICALLY FAILED POLICY

George W. Bush has played dice with the lives of American soldiers and innocent Iraqis. The risk he took was not a calculated one, but an irresponsible hunch. Staying the course and sacrificing more lives for a failed policy and an unachievable victory is not an option any longer.

The argument that we must "protect" Iraqis from takeover by al Qaeda who will make Iraq a haven and staging area for terrorists is false. This is essentially the domino theory applied to Iraq and it is as much a fallacy as it was when applied to Vietnam, because it is based on a complete underestimation of human beings and of their desire for self-determination.

The idea that, if we leave the Iranians or the Syrians will take over the country, is equally a red herring. The Iraqis don't want to be dominated by Iran or by Syria or by al Qaeda any more than they want to be dominated by the U.S. or than they wanted to be under the thumb of the British in the 1920s. The Vietnamese fought French domination just as fiercely as they later fought American interference.

Neither is it a certainty that things will worsen if we leave Iraq. To date the previously sporadic and disorganized sectarian violence is intensifying into organized civil war, with coherent armed factions fighting each other. But this is happening despite our troop presence.


No one knows exactly how things will play out when we leave, but we can be sure that Iraqis are fully capable of fashioning their own future. In fact they are the only ones who can. They will not be able to do that fully until we are gone.

As a veteran of the citizen movement to bring the troops home from Vietnam, I recall only too clearly both the predictions of the blood bath that would surely ensue if we left, and the peace that actually did. The parallel is not perfect, because prior to our withdrawal, the Vietnamese civil war had gone on considerably longer than the current war in Iraq. However, the Vietnam experience certainly gives us no cause to believe that our continued presence in Iraq will stop or even curb the violence there.

As was predicted, Bush's policy has opened Pandora's box. The snakes are out and are unlikely to be returned before they have spewed their poison.

But what we *can* learn from Vietnam is that the withdrawal of a foreign occupying force changes the internal domestic picture substantially. We can only hope that in Iraq's case the difference will be substantial enough for Iraq's own voices of reason to be heard. That chance is worth taking.
