

## ORDINANCE No. 184924

Authorize Intergovernmental Grant Agreement and accept funds from Metro in the amount of \$16,000 for the Multifamily Recycling program to support waste reduction and recycling outreach and assistance for multifamily communities in Portland (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. Both the State of Oregon and the City of Portland have adopted aggressive waste-reduction goals that rely on increasing recycling for all sectors—residential, multifamily and commercial.
2. Multifamily is defined as any multi-dwelling building or group of buildings that contain(s) five dwelling units or more on a single tax lot, such as apartments, condominiums, mobile home parks, or houseboat moorages. Multifamily also includes certified or licensed residential care housing, such as adult foster care homes or group homes. Over twenty-five percent of Portland residents live in multifamily communities.
3. Multifamily is defined as commercial under the City of Portland's Administrative Rules regarding solid waste, recycling and compostables.
4. On April 30, 2008, City Council adopted Resolution No. 36601 that established the following goals for the commercial solid waste and recycling system:
  - promote sustainability of the solid waste and recycling system that includes maximum efficiency, equity and economic vitality, improved worker safety and reduced environmental and human health impacts over the entire life cycle of the materials; and
  - minimize the impact of harmful wastes by targeting toxicity and reducing greenhouse gases emissions; and
  - reduce per capita waste generation below 2005 levels by the year 2015; and
  - maximize recovery of all waste with a target of 75% by the year 2015 and promote highest value use of the recovered materials.
5. As of July 2005, Solid Waste and Recycling Administrative Rules mandate that all recycling and garbage companies collect recyclables from multifamily complexes using a two-sort system. To support property managers, owner, tenants and garbage and recycling companies implementing this requirement, the City of Portland delivers a recycling program that providing free resources and technical assistance targeted at multifamily properties.
6. Metro has committed \$16,000 to help the City of Portland pay for the placement of an AmeriCorps member.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland a grant in the amount of \$16,000 from Metro for Multifamily Recycling education and outreach and to enter into an intergovernmental agreement in a form substantially in accordance with the agreement attached as Exhibit A.
- b. The FY 2011/2012 budget is hereby amended as follows:

GRANTS FUND

Business Area – PN00

Bureau Program Expenses—\$16,000

- c. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.
- d. The Director of Bureau of Planning and Sustainability of the City of Portland is authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland any subsequent modifications by Metro for the Multifamily Recycling Program grant, Metro Contract No. 930830, City Grant Number PN000028 provided such modifications do not increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by the Portland City Council.
