Representatives from Hoyt Street Property (land owner) and Cavalia met with the Pearl District Neighborhood Association on September 8, 2011. The PDNA unanimously supported the Cavalia.

BDS is able to move this legislation forward due to the neighborhood support.

RE: Cavalia 2011-2012 Portland Event

The Bureau of Development Services has prepared an ordinance to allow the Cavalia to use the Hoyt Street Properties LLC (HSP) properties at 1350 NW Savier Street for the 2011-12 event. The ordinance waives the related City of Portland Planning and Zoning Code requirements to allow the event to exceed the time limits for temporary activities (two weeks) in an EXd zone, and to allow parking that will be accessory to this use.

Background

The Cavalia is a circus-type event with a unique combination of equestrian arts, multimedia, dance and acrobatics. Since 2003, the first year of production, Cavalia has presented in 43 cities around the world. Cavalia was the brainchild of Normand Latourelle, who helped built the famous Cirque du Soleil. The Cavalia is coming to Portland in mid-October 2011 through mid-January 2012. This will be the first time Cavalia has performed in Portland. For previous circus type events City Council has waived all land use requirements because the event was deemed "temporary."

The Cavalia is also requesting the use of two additional Pearl District lots for temporary parking for use of the Cavalia patrons. The two lots are also owned by the Hoyt Street Properties LLC and HSP has asked that these two lots be included in the Cavalia event approval. Using these two parking lots will provide approximately 500 temporary on-site parking which will lessen the need for patron parking in the surrounding neighborhoods. Cavalia will also provide bicycle parking and encourage patrons to use the Portland Street Car and Tri-Met buses.

The event site is located at 1350 NW Savier Street, just south of the Fremont Bridge right of way and west of NW Naito Parkway. All lots are owned by Hoyt Street Properties LLC (HSP). HSP has granted Cavalia permission to use the lots from October 2011 through January 2012. Construction activity for the 2011-2012 event will

start on October 15, 2011; the performances will run from November 22, 2011 through January 7, 2012. The site will be cleared of the tents by January 15, 2012.

HSP and Cavalia representatives met with the Pearl District Neighborhood Association. The PDNA voted unanimously to approve Cavalia in the Pearl.

Building permits are required to prepare the site and place the tents for the 2011-2012 event. Building permits must be obtained prior to any work starting on the site.

Through this ordinance the Council waives the related Zoning Code requirements for a period of up to 93 days to allow the Cavalia to hold the 2011-2012 event at 1350 NW Savier Street and allow the use of two additional HSP Pearl District lots for temporary parking for the Cavalia patron parking.
