## 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

-history of project – Due to the advanced age and increasing maintenance and repair costs associated with the two current in-service fireboats in Portland Fire & Rescue's fleet (the 27 year old *Williams* and the 15 year old *Buss*), funds granted via the General Obligation Bond approved by the City's voters will be used to replace these aging assets with two new state-of-the-art fireboats. In order for this allocation to proceed, the RFP process will be utilized to solicit proposals from qualified bidders to build these two identical fireboats. The timeline from RFP to final delivery is anticipated to encompass approximately three years with the delivery projected to take place sometime in the year 2014. These fireboats will be equipped with the latest technology in propulsion, navigation, safety and firefighting equipment to effectively and efficiently serve the City for many years to come.
