1) **Legislation Title:** Authorize renewal of Afterschool At-Risk Meal Program Sponsorship (Ordinance).

2) **Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:** This legislation authorizes Portland Parks & Recreation's (PP&R) renewal of afterschool meal programs at St. Johns and University Park Community Centers. Renewing the sponsorship allows PP&R to enter into an agreement with Centennial School District to provide meals, and to accept federal grant funding for reimbursement of meal costs.

This legislation allows PP&R to accept federal grant funding in the amount of approximately \$21,000. Actual amount will vary based on program enrollment and number of creditable meals served.

5) **Expense:** What are the costs to the City as a result of this legislation? What is the source of funding for the expense?

Actual costs will vary based on program enrollment and number of creditable meals served. Based on current projections, meal service cost is expected to be approximately \$23,000. \$21,000 is expected in federal grant reimbursement. Expenses not covered by reimbursement will be paid by PP&R Park Services Manager's budget. Cost to PP&R is expected to be approximately \$2,000.


