7. **BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:**

To support the Council sponsored Citizen Technology Oversight Committee the City of Portland, Bureau of Technology Services, has a need for project quality assurance services on an as-needed basis as projects are identified. Work under these contracts will focus on quality assurance oversight for various technology related projects under the oversight of the Citizen Technology Oversight Committee. These as-needed services will be referred to as "on-call services" and generally include work with immediate response, short deadlines, scopes that may need to be developed quickly, and/or requiring expertise currently unavailable inhouse. The newly created Citizen Technology Oversight Committee is now up and running and these contracts will be leveraged immediately to provide quality assurance service to support the Citizen Technology Oversight Committee.
