The purchase price of the Property is \$108,000. The Director of Parks reports that the Property meets the Park Systems Development Charge ("SDC") acquisition guidelines and that there is adequate revenue from the Park SDC to fund acquisition of the Property. The Director of Parks estimates a one-time site stabilization cost of up to \$23,000 to prepare the Property for public ownership and includes removal or demolition of a single family residence. Stabilization costs will be funded from Park SDC funds. The Director of Parks estimates that the on-going O&M cost will be approximately \$7,700 per year to maintain the property as part of Raymond Park.
