7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Attached is an ordinance to authorize amendment reauthorizing the City's participation in the Visitor Development Fund Services Agreement, including any future amendments to the Agreement.

In February 2000, through Ordinance No. 174215, the City Council authorized the creation of a nonprofit corporation whose Board included representatives of Multnomah County, Metro, and the Portland Oregon Visitors Association, now known as Travel Portland.

Through Ordinance No. 174215, the Visitor Development Fund Services Agreement established this non-profit to receive certain designated proceeds of the County tax increases and expending those revenues to attract visitors to Portland and Multnomah County that maximize hotel occupancy and vehicle rentals.

The Visitor Development Fund established a board of directors comprised of representatives of the visitor services industry and government officials including members of the County Commission, City Council and Metro.

The Visitor Development Fund Services Agreement acknowledged that the City Charter limited the duration of contract terms to 5 years with one 5-year renewal which expired April 2010.

The Visitor Development Fund Services Agreement provided at the end of each 10-year period, the City Council could reauthorize the City's participation in this Agreement and the other parties agreed

to enter into another agreement with the City on the same terms contained in this Agreement, as it may have been amended.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

It is recommended Council reauthorize the City's participation in the Visitor Development Fund Services Agreement with Multnomah County, Metro, and the Visitor Development Fund, Inc., an Oregon nonprofit corporation.
