2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

The Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) requested the creation of a new classification of Environmental Policy and Hazardous Materials Coordinator (EPHMC) to reflect the bureau's development of a more robust hazardous materials program as required by the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality. The Bureau of Human Resources (BHR) reviewed this request and determined that a new classification was required to adequately reflect the more complex responsibilities that accompany working with hazardous waste and materials. One Environmental Policy Analyst will be reclassified to staff this function within PBOT. The new EPHMC classification will be represented by COPPEA. This is an emergency ordinance so that this compensation action can be made effective without delay.

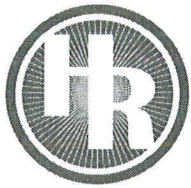
