a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

In general, the scale of the proposed activities (overnight sleeping for people experiencing homelessness on the properties of religious institutions and community services provided by non-profit agencies) is expected to be very small. Few negative impacts are anticipated, as participating hosts must understand and seek to minimize negative offsite impacts (like noise, odors, and glare) for neighboring properties. The proposed activities should allow hosts to help facilitate safety and a good night's sleep for people experiencing homelessness.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

Preliminary planning meetings involved Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon, the Outreach and Engagement Workgroup of the inter-jurisdictional Coordinating Committee to End Homelessness, faith community leaders, non-profit community service providers, and representatives of Multnomah County government.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

These preliminary planning meeting helped identify concerns associated with potential negative impacts, generate recommendations for mitigating them, and helped to shape the scope of proposed activities.

d) Who designed and implemented the public involvement related to this Council item?

It was collaboratively designed and implemented by faith community leaders, the Portland Housing Bureau, the Bureau of Development Services, and staff of Commissioners Fish and Saltzman.
