7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

The Bureau of Transportation requested a classification review for nine positions in the Environmental System Maintenance Technician classification. There are two groups of employees in this classification that have different responsibilities and have different knowledge and skill requirements. The Bureau of Human Resources (BHR) reviewed this request and determined that two new classifications were needed to properly classify this work. BHR is recommending the creation of the Collection System Video Inspector and Collection System Investigator classifications. These classifications will be represented by District Council of Trade Unions (DCTU), Laborers' International Union, Local 483.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

There is no direct cost to create the two new classifications. Six Environmental System Maintenance Technician positions will be reclassified to the new Collection System Video Inspector classification. Three Environmental System Maintenance Technician positions will be reclassified to the new Collection System Investigator classification. BHR is recommending an annual maximum rate of \$54,829 for both the Collection System Investigator and the Collection System Video Inspector classifications. This is the same annual maximum as the current Environmental System Maintenance Technician classification. There will be no increase in cost to reclassify the positions.

9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

I recommend that the Mayor and City Council approve this ordinance.
