None. This is an ongoing volunteer-citizen appointment to the DRAC.

DRAC positions are designated to represent various customer and stakeholder groups to the development process, including neighborhood interests; the position referenced in this legislation represents Neighborhood Coalition Land Use Committees. BDS sent a notification to the Office of Neighborhood Involvement (ONI) about the vacant position, inviting neighborhood and business associations to assist in reaching out to potential applicants. BDS also included information about the vacancy in the July/August issue of its *Plans Examiner* newsletter (see <http://www.portlandonline.com/bds/index.cfm?c=53981&a=356266>). The *Plans Examiner* is widely distributed electronically to BDS customers and stakeholders, as well as neighborhood associations and community groups. In addition, BDS encouraged DRAC members to spread the word about the vacancy in their spheres of influence and encourage others to apply.

Subsequent to these outreach efforts, applications were received by ONI and forwarded to BDS.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

Since individuals must apply for DRAC vacancies, the participation of neighborhood associations, ONI, and other stakeholders was crucial to generating applications and filling the vacant position.
