a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

The charge of the Portland Plan Community Involvement Committee is to review and make recommendations on the public involvement efforts for the Portland Plan and the Comprehensive Plan Update. The committee reviews past involvement efforts and results and previews upcoming involvement activities. The committee makes recommendations to the Planning & Sustainability Commission (PSC) and staff on ways to continue or improve its public involvement activities so they meet the overall goals of the public involvement work program.

Appointing Lois Cohen and Kevin Pozzi will fill vacancies left on the Portland Plan Community Involvement Committee by Angie Thompson and Rahul Rastogi.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

Several groups were contacted regarding the vacancies on the Portland Plan Community Involvement Committee and were requested to encourage individuals within their constituencies to apply. These groups included the following: each organization that makes up the Diversity and Civic Leadership Partners, the Housing Authority of Portland, Milepost 5 and the Neighborhood Coalitions. Several community leaders and individuals were also emailed and/or called directly in order to share this opportunity.

The Mayor's Office included the announcement on Mayor Adams blog, as did the Portland Plan website. The announcement was posted on the Portland Plan Facebook page and included on the Portland Plan twitter feed.

The original applicant pool from 2008, approximately 68 individuals, was also contacted to gauge interest for being considered during this selection process.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

The Portland Plan Community Involvement Committee identified community perspectives that were missing from the committee and helped shaped the targeted outreach to the specific community-based organizations and community groups that were contacted, as listed in the response to Question 9b above.

The Portland Plan Community Involvement Committee, along with the Portland Plan Public Involvement team (mainly Bureau of Planning and Sustainability staff) designed the public involvement and conducted the outreach.
