The anticipated impact of this legislation is that there will be a greater awareness in the community regarding the initiatives of the Public Involvement Advisory Council (PIAC). Community input and involvement on PIAC's initiatives will improve PIAC's work and ultimately help fulfill PIAC's mission to enhance the community's ability to interact with City government and have their voices heard and considered on the decisions that affect them.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

Various community members were involved in the work of the PIAC that is described in this annual report. 18 community members from diverse backgrounds serve on the PIAC and inform and develop the PIAC's initiatives on an ongoing basis. In addition, PIAC members and staff hold focus groups, present at community meetings and hold one-on-one meetings with interested community members on an ongoing basis to collect input.

Groups that were consulted in the process of PIAC's work include neighborhood coalitions, diversity and civic leadership organizations, local civic engagement organizations, youth organizations, public involvement professionals, etc.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

The 18 community members from diverse backgrounds that serve on the PIAC serve as the primary form of public involvement for the PIAC's work. Their input directly affects PIAC's initiatives, as the PIAC uses a consensus driven model of decision making. In addition, input collected from the broader community is strongly considered throughout the PIAC's process.
