RESOLUTION No.

Require an actual physical fitness test as the eligibility requirement for the Portland Police Bureau Health and Fitness Pay Premium (Resolution)

- WHEREAS, Portland City Council wants all city employees to maintain a standard of physical fitness that facilitates a healthy and productive lifestyle, and
- WHEREAS, Portland City Council, through the Bureau of Human Resources, continually looks for opportunities that will enrich an employee's work experience including fitness programs, and
- WHEREAS, The Portland Police Association bargained in good faith with Portland City Council to include a Health & Fitness Premium program in the most recent labor contract, and
- WHEREAS, The rationale behind an officer receiving premium pay was to create an ongoing incentive to maintain a high level of physical fitness, and
- WHEREAS, Portland City Council approved the most recent labor agreement with the Portland Police Association when told that the test administered to receive this pay premium would be a "physical fitness test" which would show an ability to perform the physical duties of a Portland Police Officer, and
- WHEREAS, It was estimated that 70% of bureau members would qualify for this premium pay but currently 91% of members have qualified, thus accounting for overspending in the Police Bureau's budget, and
- WHEREAS, It has come to light that the "test" administered this year to receive the premium pay is merely a biometric screening that includes a small blood sample, blood pressure reading and determination of body mass ratio, and
- WHEREAS, The manner in which the labor agreement has been interpreted by the Bureau of Human Resources and the Portland Police Bureau is unacceptable to the City Council and does not meet a reasonable definition of a "physical fitness test", and
- WHEREAS, The Portland City Council may not be the most physically fit group of elected representatives but it is certainly able to discern when an agreement made in good faith is not being kept by all parties.
- NOW, THERFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council directs the Bureau of Human Resources and the Portland Police Bureau to utilize an actual "physical fitness test" as an eligibility requirement for the Health & Fitness pay premium; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council rescinds the Health & Fitness premium until such time as an actual "physical fitness test" is administered.
