BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS: Ordinance Number 183467, adopted on January 13, 2010, authorized a contract and provided payment for the Linnton Pump Station Improvements project to abandon and decommission the Upper Linnton Tank, and upgrade the existing North Linnton Pump Station and associated water mains to provide direct supply of the distribution system. The improvements will increase available fire flow to current required levels for the service area.
- FINANCIAL IMPACT: The estimated project cost as designed was \$1,400,000 (optimal level of confidence). The bid by Stettler Supply & Construction is for the total of \$501,125.00. Funds are available in the Portland Water Bureau Owner Cost Center WAEN000011.
- 9. <u>RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED:</u> Accept Recommendation to award contract to Stettler Supply & Construction in the amount of \$ 501,125.00.
- **10.** <u>SCOPE OF WORK ON PROJECT</u>: The project includes all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and supervision necessary for demolition, burial and landscaping of abandoned reservoirs and the necessary North Linnton Pump station improvements to allow for conversion to direct supply of the distribution system. These improvements include replacement of pumps, piping, instrumentation and electrical systems and will result in increased available fire flow to meet current required levels for the service area.
