- 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS: Ordinance Number 185044 adopted on December 7, 2011 authorized a contract and provided for payment for the Fields Neighborhood Park Project. Resolution #35736 passed by the City Council on October 21, 1998 adopted the River District Parks Report and directed the Portland Development Commission and Portland Parks & Recreation to jointly manage the design and construction of the River District Parks, including the Fields Neighborhood Park.
- 8. FINANCIAL IMPACT: The engineer's estimate for this project was \$3,800,000 and the confidence level was high. Funding for this project is available in the Fiscal Year 2010-2011 Revised and Fiscal Year 2011-2012 Requested River District Urban Renewal Area budget.
- 9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED: Accept recommendation to award the contract to R & R General Contractors, Inc. in the amount of \$3,083,195.
- 10. SCOPE OF WORK ON PROJECT: The project includes all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and supervision necessary for the new construction of The Fields Neighborhood Park, including clearing and grubbing, excavation, grading, water
