The NE 21st Ave Bridge over the Columbia Slough is located in N Portland's Freight District, and is a vital link for businesses operating in the NE Argyle Street & Riverside Way business loop adjacent Columbia Boulevard. There is a required closure for this bridge which will last 3 months during the summer of 2012. However, the detour is less than 1 mile to the NE 33rd Ave Bridge.
