The Zoning Code requires for a Type III Land Use Review that public notice be mailed to property owners within 300 feet of the subject site and that the site be posted for a minimum of 30 days prior to the first hearing before the Hearings Officer. The notice also goes to the neighborhood association and any city-recognized business associations. Notices of hearings are also posted on the BDS website. There are no other public involvement efforts on the part of city staff.
  - c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item? The appeal of this quasi-judicial action is a direct outcome of public involvement on the part of neighbors and the neighborhood association in opposition to the proposal.
  - d) Who designed and implemented the public involvement related to this Council item? City Council adopted the procedures outlined in the Zoning Code. The Bureau of Development Services implements these procedures.
