2011 Portland/ Multnomah County Homeless Street Count Long Form Survey Summary of Findings

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The point-in-time count of homelessness in Portland and Multnomah County provides a snapshot of the individuals and families experiencing homelessness on a given night in our community. Data for the point-in-time count comes from the Street Count, which captures information on people who are unsheltered (sleeping outside, in vehicles, abandoned buildings or other places not intended for human habitation), and the One Night Shelter Count, which captures information on people who are sleeping in shelters or transitional housing or receiving rent assistance or permanent supportive housing. The 2011 point-in-time count took place on Wednesday, January 26.

The Street Count long-form survey was a supplemental survey conducted in conjunction with the 2011 point-in-time count in an effort to gather more in-depth information about the background and needs of Portland/ Multnomah County's unsheltered population. The survey was administered to a sample of 263 of the 1,718 Street Count respondents.

Key findings include:

- Unemployment and inability to pay rent were the most common reasons why respondents had to leave their last stable living situation.
- 80% of respondents said they have been unable to obtain housing due to lack of affordability and/or lack of income.
- 31% of respondents had no monthly income; conversely, 22% had \$600 or more in monthly income.
- The most common sources of income were recycling/ canning and panhandling.
- 9% of respondents had earned income from employment, but none had full-time employment.
- 49% of respondents are looking for work or an increase in hours; 55% of respondents said they had been unable to find employment because of the recession.
- 24% of respondents have not completed any education beyond the eighth grade; 53% of respondents have completed high school or a GED.
- In response to the question, "What services would you like but can't access?", the most common responses
 were help finding housing, help paying for housing, health care/ medical care, help finding a job, clothing, and
 help applying for benefits.
- More than a third of respondents have a mental health and/or chronic health condition.
- 19% of respondents have children under the age of 18 who are not living with them.
- 19% of respondents have pets living with them.
- Over the past six months, 48% of respondents have been in an emergency room or hospital.
- 46% of respondents have experienced physical violence or an attack since they have been homeless.
- 21% of respondents have a history of foster care.

The long-form survey findings offer useful insights, but should be interpreted with caution because the long-form respondents do not completely mirror the overall sample of Street Count respondents. Consequently, the findings cannot be generalized to the unsheltered population of Multnomah County as a whole.

METHODOLOGY

The long-form survey was conducted with a sample of 263 of the 1,718 Street Count respondents. Participation was voluntary, and respondents were given \$5 gift cards to compensate them for their time. In an effort to draw a broadly representative sample, 17 participating Street Count sites and outreach organizations¹ that serve a diverse range of populations were asked to conduct the long-form survey with a sub-set of the people they surveyed for the Street Count.

While efforts were made to maximize the representativeness of the sample, it was not logistically feasible to utilize a random sampling strategy. The long-form survey took 15 minutes to an hour to administer to each respondent, so participation was generally limited to settings and respondents for which this level of time commitment was possible. Sites were asked to randomize the people they surveyed to the extent possible, but in most cases true randomization was not realistic.

Due to these methodological limitations, a comparison of the sample's characteristics with the Street Count respondent population as a whole indicates that it is not completely representative. In particular, long-form respondents are disproportionately:

- Individual adults: Despite efforts to insure that the sample included a balanced distribution of all household types, none of the respondents identified themselves as families with children. Nineteen percent of respondents have children who did not sleep outside with them on the night of the count, but none identified themselves as families with children who slept outside with them.
- Located in East County and Outer East Portland: There was an intentional effort to over-sample in East County
 and Outer East Portland in an effort to increase our understanding of the unique needs of these populations.
 As a result of this over-sampling, 32% of long-form respondents were from East County and Outer East
 Portland, compared to 13% of Street Count respondents as a whole.
- Chronically homeless and male: Fifty-eight percent of long-form respondents were chronically homeless compared to 46% of all Street Count respondents. Seventy-eight percent of long-form respondents were male compared to 73% of all Street Count respondents.

This section of the report summarizes the responses to each of the long-form survey questions. It is organized according to the order in which the questions appeared in the survey. All of the questions were multiple choice. Several questions offered space for comments or for providing more information to explain a selection of the multiple choice option of "other." Any patterns or themes from these open-ended responses are noted in the footnotes to each question.

The long-form survey included an over-sample of Outer East Portland and East County respondents in an effort to strengthen our understanding of the background and needs of that population. A total of 71 respondents slept in Outer East Portland or East County on the night of the count. This represents 27% of the total long-form sample and 32% of the long-form respondents who identified their location. Outer East and East County respondents' answers are incorporated into the body of this report but are also summarized separately in this appendix.
